Once again, to leave a name on simply contact the office and request that name stay on. Let's try it this way and see how it works, and if you have any ideas please call and share them!

Our local food banks have been facing high demands recently. Please pick up a few extra non-perishable items and bring them to church. We will collect these items and distribute them to the Community Services Food Bank in Tappahannock and Spirit Rising, a 501c3 charity for Native American children, elders and families in several counties. **You don't have to wait until Pantry Sunday to donate, bring in supplies every weekend, or weekday, we are always in need, and accepting donations!** The food pantry also needs donations of money, as they have to pay utilities for the building and pay for food from the Northern Neck Food Bank.
