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From the Pastor's Desk

### SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

You will be hearing of these terms "Synod on Synodality" a lot this year.

Just to give you a little background, whenever there seems an importance of evangelization that requires the input of various parts of the Church, the Holy Father may convene a synod, which is a meeting or assembly of church leaders, bishops and laypeople to reach consensus on important issues. A 'Synod' therefore is a Greek word that literally means 'on the same path'. In this synod of Bishops that will take place in 2023, the Holy Father has asked the whole Church to reflect on the 'journey together' on the same path in communion with one another. The theme of this synod will be Synod on Synodality focusing on Communion, Participation, and Mission of the Church. Through our participation in this synod as St. Timothy Parish, we will seek to answer the fundamental question: "A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, 'journeys together': How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your particular Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our journeying together (in solidarity which relates to Synodality)?" The Leader going to guide us in this process is John Cali. We have already made up groups and leaders in these groups as John will inform us, to lead us into the dialogue. Consultation with parishioners at deferent levels will begin in January 2022 and conclude the end of February. In March 2022, we will compile our thoughts and submit them to the Diocese, then summarized to gather with the rest of the parishes in the Diocese, they will be sent to Rome so that they may form a document that will guide the Bishops while they convene for this synod. As Our Bishop Barry Knestout has warned us in his letter, that "before local communities and individuals enter into the synodal process it is important to identify what synodality is not. While it is a time for one's voice to be heard, it is not an opportunity to push one's personal agenda. It is not a democratic process where the majority rules or a corporate strategic process. Synodality leads us to listening, speaking, accepting co-responsibility for participation in the process, discerning and deciding." The results of the conversation are not what matter most, but rather that the faithful of the Parish have been able to enter into these unitive moments of discussion with each other. More will follow on this. Therefore, brothers and sisters, in communion, let us with one another to listen to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and prayerfully discern God's will for us. Our mission, as a faith community, is to act upon what we've heard.

Escuchará mucho sobre estos términos "Sínodo sobre sinodalidad" este año. Solo para darles un poco de antecedentes, siempre que parezca una importancia de la evangelización que requiera el aporte de varias partes de la Iglesia, el Santo Padre puede convocar un sínodo, que es una reunión o asamblea de líderes eclesiásticos, obispos y laicos para llegar a un consenso. sobre temas importantes. Por tanto, un "Sínodo" es una palabra griega que literalmente significa "en el mismo camino". En este sínodo de obispos que tendrá lugar en 2023, el Santo Padre ha pedido a toda la Iglesia que reflexione sobre el 'camino juntos' por el mismo camino en comunión unos con otros. El tema de este sínodo será el Sínodo sobre sinodalidad centrado en la Comunión, Participación y Misión de la Iglesia. A través de nuestra participación en este sínodo como Parroquia de San Timoteo, buscaremos responder a la pregunta fundamental: "Una Iglesia sinodal, al anunciar el Evangelio, 'camina juntos': ¿Cómo está sucediendo este 'caminar juntos' hoy en su Iglesia particular? ¿Qué pasos nos invita a dar el Espíritu para crecer en nuestro caminar juntos (en la solidaridad que se relaciona con la sinodalidad)? " El Líder que nos guiará en este proceso es John Cali. Ya hemos formado grupos y líderes en estos grupos como nos informará John, para llevarnos al diálogo. La consulta con los feligreses de diferentes niveles comenzará en enero de 2022 y concluirá a fines de febrero. En marzo de 2022, recopilaremos nuestros pensamientos y los enviaremos a la Diócesis, luego resumidos para reunirlos con el resto de las parroquias de la Diócesis, serán enviados a Roma para que formen un documento que guiará a los Obispos mientras ellos convocar para este sínodo. Como nos advierte nuestro obispo Barry Knestout en su carta, "antes de que las comunidades locales y los individuos entren en el proceso sinodal, es importante identificar qué no es la sinodalidad. Si bien es un momento para que se escuche la voz de uno, no es una oportunidad para impulsar la agenda personal de uno. No es un proceso democrático donde gobierna la mayoría ni un proceso estratégico empresarial. La sinodalidad nos lleva a escuchar, hablar, aceptar la corresponsabilidad de participación en el proceso, discernir y decidir ". Los resultados de la conversación no son lo que más importa, sino que los fieles de la Parroquia han podido entrar en estos momentos unitivos de discusión entre ellos. Más seguirán sobre esto. Por tanto, hermanos y hermanas, en comunión, escuchemos los unos con los otros para escuchar la inspiración del Espíritu Santo y discernir con oración la voluntad de Dios para nosotros. Nuestra misión, como comunidad de fe, es actuar de acuerdo con lo que hemos escuchado.


### Joke of the Week


