

Some Thoughts on today's scripture..

Some turned against Jesus, the one who spoke gracious words, or the one who spoke challenging words, and a mixture.

He was liked and not liked. There were people who were very religious and liked him, who were the backbone of Judaism, and others who went off him when he said what they didn't like or agree with. He started with the Scripture – but then went on to point out bits of the scripture they didn't like to hear – about foreigners. And later they would say – sure we knew him as a kid and his family; that meant they could write off what he said.

He was inviting them to the purity of their religion. Often happens when there are new challenges in the church. What is happening in the church where the world we live in challenges old customs and beliefs about marriage, civil partnerships, divorce, and also how to welcome people to church who don't feel they belong. All are welcome here in the love of God. We don't give up what is essential to our church but we are brought into rethinking and sometimes to change, sometimes to stay with what is an everlasting truth.

This happens in the church and in the family. We need to be able to live in love with different points of view and different ways of life. Child not baptised, marriage not in church, gay partnerships....the people are more important. Jesus is challenging them to see everyone as important, and especially the poor. He would always do this. And they would kill him for it, because he never put organised religion before people.

The words which are at first upsetting may proved to be gracious words as they were from the mouth of the Lord.

Algunos se volvieron contra Jesús, el que habló palabras de gracia, o el que habló palabras desafiantes, y una mezcla.

Le gustaba y no le gustaba. Había gente que era muy religiosa y le caía bien, que eran la columna vertebral del judaísmo, y otros que lo despedían cuando decía lo que no les gustaba o con lo que no estaban de acuerdo. Comenzó con las Escrituras, pero luego pasó a señalar partes de las Escrituras que no les gustaba escuchar, sobre los extranjeros. Y luego dirían: seguro que lo conocimos de niño y su familia; eso significaba que podían descartar lo que dijo.

Los estaba invitando a la pureza de su religión. A menudo sucede cuando hay nuevos desafíos en la iglesia. Lo que está sucediendo en la iglesia donde el mundo en el que vivimos desafía las viejas costumbres y creencias sobre el matrimonio, las uniones civiles, el divorcio y también cómo dar la bienvenida a la iglesia a las personas que no sienten que pertenecen. Todos son bienvenidos aquí en el amor de Dios. No renunciamos a lo que es esencial para nuestra iglesia, pero somos llevados a repensar y, a veces, a cambiar, a veces a quedarnos con lo que es una verdad eterna.

Esto sucede en la iglesia y en la familia. Necesitamos poder vivir enamorados con diferentes puntos de vista y diferentes formas de vida. Niño no bautizado, matrimonio fuera de la iglesia, parejas homosexuales... las personas son más importantes. Jesús los está desafiando a ver a todos como importantes, y especialmente a los pobres. Él siempre haría esto. Y lo matarían por ello, porque nunca antepuso la religión organizada a la gente.






Divine Mercy Cenacle

OPERATION INASMUCH (OIAM) is BACK!! Put April 30 on your calendar

On **Saturday, April 30**, needs in Essex County will be tackled in a "mission blitz" by about 30 churches of all denominations, working through Essex Churches Together (ECT). For two years, Covid has called a halt to Operation Inasmuch (OIAM) and its "compassion revolution". This year marks the third try to launch the effort for its 13th time. **It WILL happen in 2022**, and you can be involved.
