


# St Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter



# Parish Retreat.

Every Catholic deserves and needs a retreat once in a while. Lent is primarily the time of intense spiritual preparation for conquering our temptations using the means Jesus used. It is also the time for renewing our lives for the celebration of Easter with our Risen Lord who conquered sin and death by his suffering, death and resurrection.

We at St. Timothy, are going to have a parish retreat on Friday April 8<sup>th</sup> from 4:30pm to 6:00pm, followed by the Stations of the Cross and the Lenten Soup Supper. Second session from 7:00pm-8:00pm. Saturday April 9<sup>th</sup> first session from 9:30 to 12 noon, lunch break, closing session ends at 1:30pm. The guest speaker and retreat Master is going to be Fr. Mike Joly.

I hope this parish retreat during this Lent will increase bonding among all parishioners, renew your faith, commitment and attachment to the Body of Christ present in our faith community. The retreat is a preaching event. God's Word is proclaimed through the Bible and Catholic doctrine. In times past parish retreats were often seen as a time to "scare the hell" out of people, putting the fear of the Lord into them. However, its main emphasis is centered upon how much the loving Lord desires to encounter and save each one of us, just like the story of a son who squandered his inheritance as we hear in this Sundays Gospel. A parish retreat is also a time of grace, a time for repentance, for change, for becoming a renewed person. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an essential result of a good Parish retreat. St. Alphonsus used to say that the thermometer for a successful mission was judged by how many people used the confessional. I hope to see all of you at this year's parish retreat. # Support for the people in the Ukraine

The need to support Ukrainians displaced by the war continues to grow. The Knights of Columbus is working with our councils in Poland and Ukraine, as well as the Latin and Greek Catholic Churches in Ukraine, to provide much-needed hope in the form of temporary shelter, food, medical supplies, clothing, and communications. The delivery and distribution of supplies are part of an Order wide effort to provide immediate aid to Ukrainian refugees and displaced families. Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly encouraged the Order's more than 2 million members to respond with continued prayers and material support, particularly through donations to the Order's Ukraine Solidarity Fund. In addition to an immediate \$1 million commitment and \$500,000 of matched funds from the Knights of Columbus United in Charity Fund, more than \$4.5 million has been raised, as of mid-March, to directly assist relief efforts for internally displaced persons and Ukrainian refugees. 100% of all donations will go directly to this effort. 

# Volunteer Opportunities


