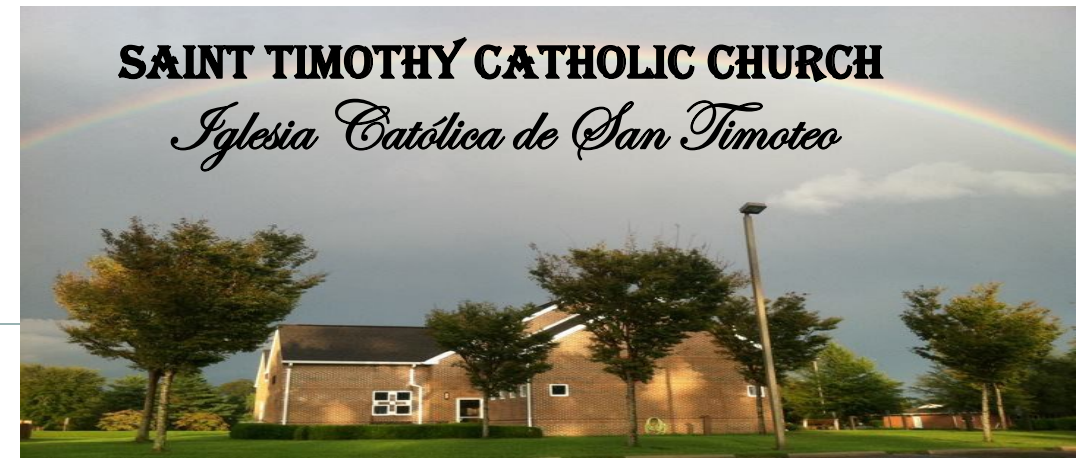

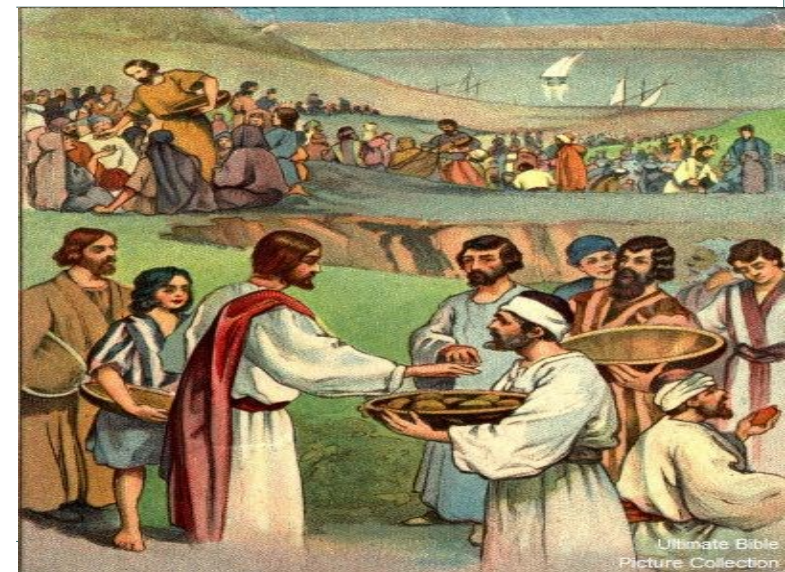

The Corpus Christi Procession.

Procession is a word which belongs in our vocabulary of the divine, and because the Christian doctrine of God is a doctrine of processions: the Son proceeds from the Father, as does the Spirit. The Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. The language of proceeding means going forth, which belongs in a grammar of God. The reality of God is a reality of processions, of going out from oneself, of self-giving to another, a self-giving of love which makes the other what it is, which defines its life. So, it is always wonderful to have a Corpus Christi procession outside for all to see in the broad light of day. The reason for this, of course, is that a procession is not simply a ritual of praise and worship, it is a witness to the gospel we proclaim. This gesture is meant to bring God literally into the community, through the streets and passages where people live and work. It is a literal, not symbolic, ritual that sacralizes common space and echoes the mystery of Catholic incarnational theology: the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us, something which we ought to be shouting from the rooftops. The presence of Christ which we celebrate on Corpus Christi Day is not something static, something limited to an object or a place. It is the presence among us of the eternal offering of the Son to the Father. What we celebrate in the Eucharist is our being drawn up into the worship of heaven, our being enabled to share in the very life of God, a life of perfect self-giving in love, the life which we call Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the doctrine of the Trinity which we celebrated last Sunday. The doctrine of processions teaches that God himself is a community of self-giving love. The miracle of the Eucharist is the miracle of God's creative act because that love is poured out for us in the physical stuff of creation, the stuff transformed by God's love into the bread of life and cup of salvation on which our true lives truly depend. The celebration of the Eucharist is the telling over and again of the story of redemption: the story of that love lived out in a human life, offered once and for all in the whole of the life, death and resurrection of Christ, so that human life can at last fulfil its destiny and enjoy the communion with God for which it was created. Communion with God is a sharing in the perfect love by which the Son proceeds from the Father and the Spirit unites Father and Son. Processions are fun and should be fun. But they are also important, basic to everything which we claim about God, and underlying all that we do to celebrate those earth shattering words: "This is my body, which is given for you."

Lastly, on this Corpus Christi Sunday is also Father's Day. Thank you, all Fathers, for gluing families together. May St. Joseph the Father of Jesus continue to intercede for you. Happy Father's Day.

De la pastora

La Procesión del Corpus Christi.

Procesión es una palabra que pertenece a nuestro vocabulario de lo divino, y porque la doctrina cristiana de Dios es una doctrina de procesiones: el Hijo procede del Padre, como también el Espíritu. El Espíritu procede del Padre y del Hijo. El lenguaje de proceder significa ir adelante, lo cual pertenece a una gramática de Dios. La realidad de Dios es una realidad de procesiones, de salida de uno mismo, de entrega al otro, entrega de amor que hace del otro lo que es, que define su vida. Por lo tanto, siempre es maravilloso tener una procesión de Corpus Christi afuera para que todos la vean a la luz del día. La razón de esto, por supuesto, es que una procesión no es simplemente un ritual de alabanza y adoración, es un testimonio del evangelio que proclamamos. Este gesto está destinado a traer a Dios literalmente a la comunidad, a través de las calles y pasajes donde la gente vive y trabaja. Es un ritual literal, no simbólico, que sacraliza el espacio común y hace eco del misterio de la teología católica de la encarnación: el Verbo se hizo carne y habitó entre nosotros, algo que deberíamos estar gritando a los cuatro vientos. La presencia de Cristo que celebramos el día del Corpus Christi no es algo estático, algo limitado a un objeto o un lugar. Es la presencia entre nosotros de la eterna ofrenda del Hijo al Padre. Lo que celebramos en la Eucaristía es nuestro ser atraídos a la adoración del cielo, nuestro ser capacitados para compartir la vida misma de Dios, una vida de entrega perfecta en amor, la vida que llamamos Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. , la doctrina de la Trinidad que celebramos el pasado domingo. La doctrina de las procesiones enseña que Dios mismo es una comunidad de amor abnegado. El milagro de la Eucaristía es el milagro del acto creativo de Dios porque ese amor se derrama por nosotros en la materia física de la creación, la materia transformada por el amor de Dios en el pan de vida y la copa de salvación de la que realmente depende nuestra verdadera vida. La celebración de la Eucaristía es la narración una y otra vez de la historia de la redención: la historia de ese amor vivido en una vida humana, ofrecido de una vez por todas en toda la vida, muerte y resurrección de Cristo, para que el hombre la vida puede por fin cumplir su destino y gozar de la comunión con Dios para la que fue creada. La comunión con Dios es participación en el amor perfecto por el que el Hijo procede del Padre y el Espíritu une al Padre y al Hijo. Las procesiones son divertidas y deben ser divertidas. Pero también son importantes, básicos para todo lo que decimos acerca de Dios, y subyacen a todo lo que hacemos para celebrar esas palabras trascendentales: "Esto es mi cuerpo, que es entregado por vosotros".

Por último, en este domingo de Corpus Christi también es el Día del Padre. Gracias, todos los padres, por unir a las familias. Que San José, el Padre de Jesús, siga intercediendo por vosotros. Feliz Día del Padre.

The rules of the liturgy say the Blessed Sacrament should be treated with reverence. You left the Church immediately with no prayer of thanksgiving. You were carrying the Blessed Sacrament within you. So I asked the boys to accompany you to honor Him.” — After Communion you and I are tabernacles – the physical presence of Jesus continues in us for a brief time. That’s why we have the Communion hymn, a time of silence, the Communion Prayer — and even the announcements to build up the Body of Christ in practical ways. KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The Eucharist: Source of Our Healing and Hope Knights of Columbus supporting Pro-Life

Knights of Columbus jurisdiction leaders gathered in New Haven, Conn., June 8-12, for the 2022 Organizational Meeting of State Deputies. Events included Masses, keynote addresses from the supreme knight and supreme chaplain. During the meeting, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly reiterated his call for Knights to be “Knights of Eucharist,” particularly in support of the National Eucharistic Revival, and he announced a new pro-life initiative to increase council support for pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes.

The National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year initiative called for by the U.S. Catholic Conference of Catholic Bishops and supported by the Knights of Columbus, will begin Sunday, June 19 — the feast of Corpus Christi in the United States.
