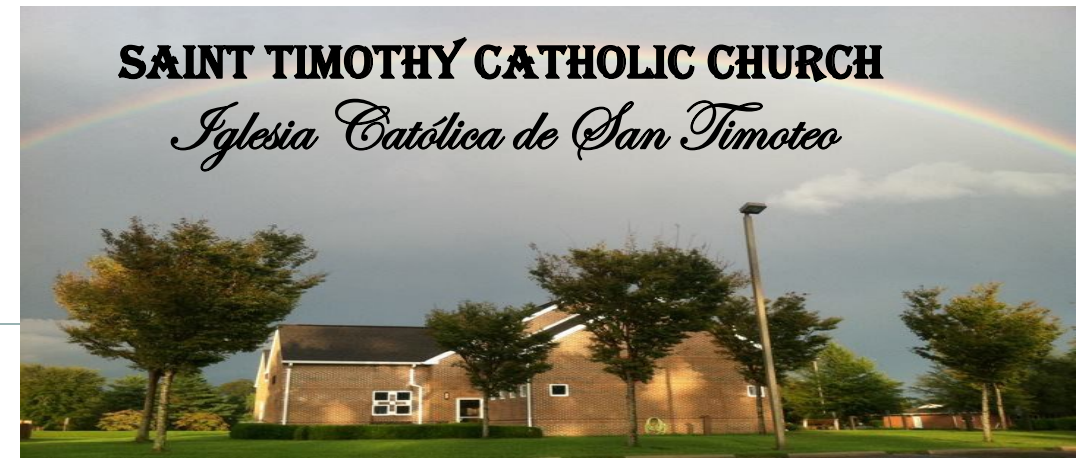

The Solemnity of Pentecost

Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. For Christians, it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The Paschal Mystery, that is, the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus, culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father (at the request of His Son), on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church through the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church. But years ago, *This Rock Magazine* reported that there were 34,000 Protestant denominations which means that, on the average, more than sixty-nine new denominations had sprung up every year since the Reformation began in 1517. So, whose birthday is it anyway? We say Pentecost is the birthday of the Church Jesus established nearly 2,000 years ago. Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. The main theme of the feast is that the gift of the Holy Spirit which is to be shared with others. In other words, the gift of the Holy Spirit moves its recipients to action and inspires them to share this gift with others. Let us be the bearers of the Holy spirit to others.

La Solemnidad de Pentecostés

Pentecostés marca el final y la meta del tiempo pascual. Para los cristianos es un memorial del día en que el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los apóstoles y la Virgen María en forma de lenguas de fuego, hecho que tuvo lugar cincuenta días después de la Resurrección de Jesús. El Misterio Pascual, es decir, la Pasión, la Muerte, la Resurrección y la Ascensión de Jesús, culmina con el envío del Espíritu Santo por el Padre (a petición de Su Hijo), sobre los discípulos de Jesús. La fiesta también conmemora la inauguración oficial de la Iglesia cristiana a través de la predicación apostólica de San Pedro, que resultó en la conversión de 3000 judíos a la fe cristiana. Pentecostés es, pues, el cumpleaños oficial de la Iglesia. Pero hace años, la revista *This Rock* informó que había 34,000 denominaciones protestantes, lo que significa que, en promedio, habían surgido más de sesenta y nueve nuevas denominaciones cada año desde que comenzó la Reforma en 1517. Entonces, ¿de quién es el cumpleaños de todos modos? Decimos que Pentecostés es el nacimiento de la Iglesia que Jesús estableció hace casi 2000 años. Pentecostés es un evento tanto del pasado como del presente. El tema principal de la fiesta es el don del Espíritu Santo que debe ser compartido con los demás. En otras palabras, el don del Espíritu Santo mueve a sus destinatarios a la acción y los inspira a compartir este don con los demás. Seamos portadores del Espíritu Santo para los demás.

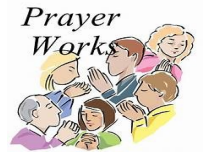
