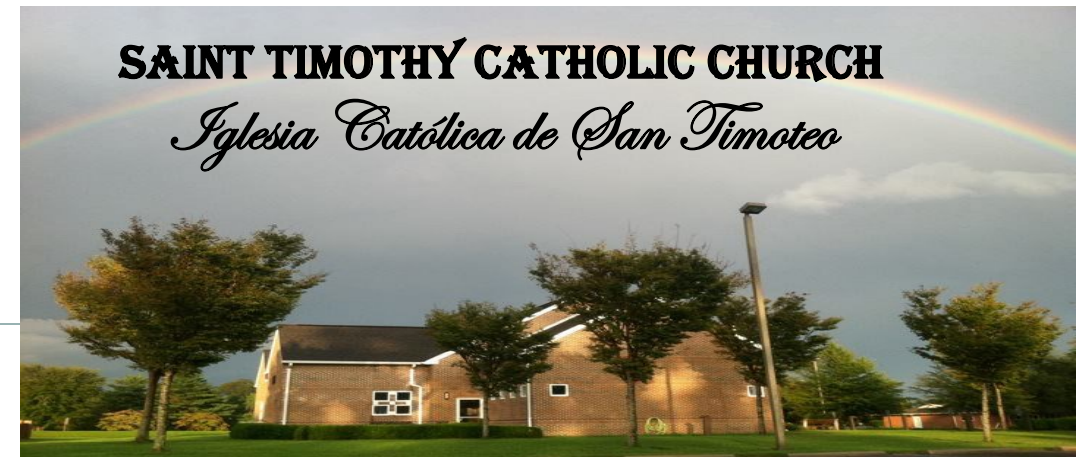

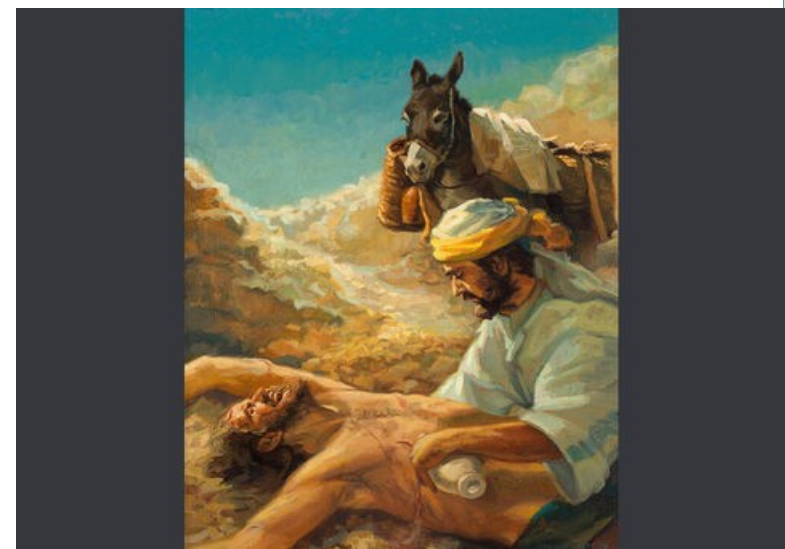

## What is the difference between the Jewish and Christian idea of the Messiah?

The idea of *mashiach* (messiah) is an ancient one in Judaism. Belief in the eventual coming of the *mashiach* is a basic and fundamental part of traditional Judaism. It is part of Rambam's 13 Principles of Faith, the minimum requirements of Jewish Belief. In the Shemoneh Esrei prayer, recited three times daily, we pray for all of the elements of the coming of the *mashiach*. The Jewish idea of *mashiach* is a great human leader like King David, not a savior. There is much speculation about when the *mashiach* will come. The Hebrew Bible identifies several tasks that the *mashiach* will accomplish. Before the time of the *mashiach*, there shall be war and suffering (Ezekiel 38:16). The *mashiach* will bring about the political and spiritual redemption of the Jewish people by bringing us back to Israel and restoring Jerusalem (Isaiah 11:11-12; Jeremiah 23:8; 30:3; Hosea 3:4-5). He will establish a government in Israel that will be the center of all world government, both for Jews and gentiles (Isaiah 2:2-4; 11:10; 42:1). He will rebuild the Temple and re-establish its worship (Jeremiah 33:18). He will restore the religious court system of Israel and establish Jewish law as the law of the land (Jeremiah 33:15). Jews do not believe in Jesus as the messiah because he did not accomplish these tasks. Modern scholars suggest that the messianic concept was introduced later in the history of Judaism, during the age of the prophets. According to Christian belief Jesus is God incarnated to save mankind from sin by his suffering, death and resurrection. So, Jesus is the Savior Messiah.

## De la pastora

### ¿Cuál es la diferencia entre la idea judía y cristiana del Mesías?

La idea de *mashiach* (mesías) es antigua en el judaísmo. La creencia en la eventual venida del *mashiach* es una parte básica y fundamental del judaísmo tradicional. Es parte de los 13 Principios de Fe de Rambam, los requisitos mínimos de la Creencia Judía. En la oración *Shemoneh Esrei*, recitada tres veces al día, oramos por todos los elementos de la venida del *mashiach*. La idea judía de *mashiach* es un gran líder humano como el rey David, no un salvador. Hay mucha especulación acerca de cuándo vendrá el *Mashíaj*. La Biblia hebrea identifica varias tareas que realizará el *mashíaj*. Antes del tiempo del *mashíaj*, habrá guerra y sufrimiento (Ezequiel 38:16). El *mashiach* traerá la redención política y espiritual del pueblo judío al traernos de regreso a Israel y restaurar Jerusalén (Isaías 11:11-12; Jeremías 23:8; 30:3; Oseas 3:4-5). Establecerá un gobierno en Israel que será el centro de todo gobierno mundial, tanto para judíos como para gentiles (Isaías 2:2-4; 11:10; 42:1). Él reconstruirá el Templo y restablecerá su adoración (Jeremías 33:18). Él restaurará el sistema judicial religioso de Israel y establecerá la ley judía como la ley de la tierra (Jeremías 33:15). Los judíos no creen en Jesús como el Mesías porque no cumplió con estas tareas. Los eruditos modernos sugieren que el concepto mesiánico se introdujo más tarde en la historia del judaísmo, durante la era de los profetas. Según la creencia cristiana, Jesús es Dios encarnado para salvar a la humanidad del pecado mediante su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección. Entonces, Jesús es el Mesías Salvador.

The Essex County-Tappahannock Triad is hosting four staff members from the Southeast Rural Community Assistance Project, Inc. (SERCAP). The Triad meeting, open to everyone in the community, is **Tuesday, July 12 at 10:00am** at the Old Beale Sanctuary, corner of Church Lane & Queen St. They'll offer details on SERCAP programs and services: water/wastewater programs, including operator training, community development grants, and individual grants for repair or replacement of well or septic systems; loans for individual well and septic systems, small businesses, and community development; housing programs such as indoor plumbing and rehabilitation, aging in place services, and dealing with lead hazards; and special projects such as operator training and entrepreneurial training. Everyone is welcome. The Triad is a partnership between local law enforcement, seniors, and senior service providers.
