



The State of Abortion Laws in Virginia

What did the U.S. Supreme Court decide? Dobbs v. Jackson Women’s Health Organization overturned Roe v. Wade and Planned Parenthood v. Casey. Which means... • There is NO federal constitutional “right” to abortion. • The power is restored to the people and their elected representatives to protect the dignity and rights of the human person from the moment of conception by enacting life-affirming laws in their states and in Congress. • While some states have already implemented total or near total limits on abortion, more than half of states – including Virginia – have few or no limits on abortion. What are the current abortion laws in Virginia? Virginia has very few limits on abortion: • 1 st trimester: No limits, and even certain non-physicians may perform the abortion. • 2 nd trimester: No limits, except that the abortion must be performed in a hospital by a physician. • 3 rd trimester: The abortion must be performed in a hospital by a physician, and the physician and two consulting physicians must certify that “the continuation of the pregnancy is likely to result in the death of the woman or substantially and irretrievably impair the mental or physical health of the woman.” The broad “mental health” language makes this requirement largely ineffective. Virginia also has a ban on partial-birth abortion and, subject to exceptions that can be granted only through a judicial process, requires parental consent for minors to obtain an abortion. What can YOU do to protect preborn children? • Pray, fast and offer sacrifice for the conversion of minds and hearts. • Advocate for pro-life laws by contacting your legislators and joining the Virginia Catholic Conference advocacy network (visit www.vacatholic.org and click “Join us!”). • Support initiatives that ensure compassionate care and support for children both before and after their birth, and for their mothers and families. De la pastora

El estado de las leyes sobre el aborto en Virginia

¿Qué decidió la Corte Suprema de los Estados Unidos? En el fallo en el caso de Dobbs contra Jackson Women’s Health Organization derogó el fallo previamente emitido en los casos de Roe contra Wade y de Planned Parenthood contra Casey. Lo cual significa que... • NO existe un “derecho” constitucional federal al aborto. • Se le devuelve a la población y a sus representantes elegidos el poder de proteger la dignidad y los derechos de la persona humana desde el momento de la concepción, al promulgar leyes de afirmación de la vida en sus estados y en el Congreso. • Aunque algunos estados ya han establecido restricciones totales o casi totales sobre el aborto, en más de la mitad de los estados – incluso en Virginia – las restricciones sobre el aborto son pocas o inexistentes. ¿Cuáles son las leyes vigentes sobre el aborto en Virginia? Virginia tiene muy pocas restricciones sobre el aborto: • 1 er trimestre: No hay restricciones y aun ciertas personas que no son médicos pueden practicar el aborto. • 2 o trimestre: No hay restricciones, con excepción de que el aborto debe practicarlo un médico en un hospital. • 3 er trimestre: El aborto debe practicarlo un médico en un hospital y ese médico y dos médicos consultores deben certificar que “la continuación del embarazo puede acarrear como resultado la muerte de la mujer o perjudicar de manera sustancial e irremediable la salud mental o física de la mujer”. La amplitud del lenguaje relativo a la “salud mental” le resta mucha efectividad a este requisito. Virginia también tiene una prohibición sobre el aborto por nacimiento parcial y, con excepciones que se pueden conceder solamente por medio de un procedimiento judicial, exige el consentimiento de los padres de familia para que los menores de edad obtengan un aborto. ¿Qué puede hacer USTED para proteger a los niños por nacer? • Rezar, ayunar y ofrecer un sacrificio por la conversión de la mente y del corazón de las personas. • Defender las leyes en pro de la vida al comunicarse con sus legisladores e ingresar a la red de defensa de la Conferencia Católica de Virginia (visite www.vacatholic.org y haga clic en “Join us!” [¡Únase a nosotros!]). • Apoyar iniciativas para asegurar el cuidado y el apoyo compasivos a los niños antes y después de nacer, al igual que a sus madres y a sus familias. KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

WHO ARE THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS?

The Knights of Columbus (K of C) is a Catholic fraternal lay organization started in Connecticut in 1881. Father Michael J. McGivney wanted to provide support to the families of men who died while working in factories. The organization grew quickly as men were drawn to the ideals of serving the church and living with loyalty, charity, and respect for others. The fraternity was named after Christopher Columbus as proof of their patriotism to the United States.

Although membership is limited to “practical” Catholic men, age 18 or older, the Knights of Columbus are known for their work outside the Catholic Church, as well. The K of C works for pro-life having donated hundreds of ultrasound machines to clinics. They work to quell religious prejudice, starting with anti-Catholic sentiment and extending into freedom-of-religion causes. Since before World War I, they have supported military service members with recreational facilities and, later, job placement. They were also instrumental in adding “under God” to the Pledge of Allegiance. Beyond participating in the various service fields, members are eligible for life, long-term care, and disability insurance. Bible Study

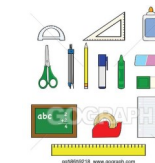
