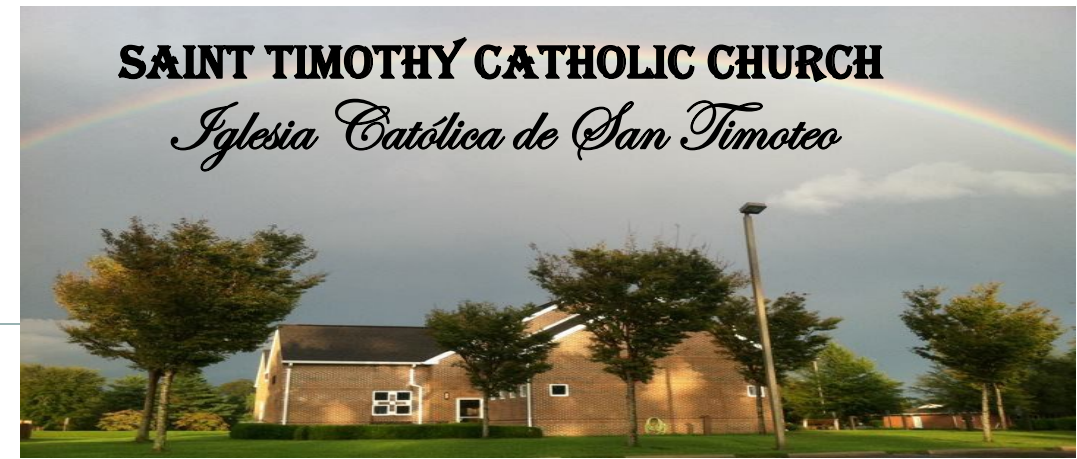

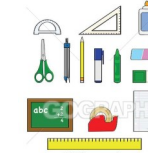
Bible Study
