World Mission Sunday

Over one billion Catholics all over the world observe today as *World Mission Sunday*. This annual observance was instituted 96 years ago in 1926 by Pope Pius XI's Papal decree. Every year since then, the universal Church has dedicated the month of October to reflection on, and prayer for the missions. On World Mission Sunday, Catholics gather to celebrate the Eucharist and to contribute to a collection for the work of evangelization around the world. This annual celebration gives us a chance to reflect on the importance of mission work for the life of the Church. It reminds us that we are one with the Church around the world and that we are all committed to carrying on the mission of Christ, however different our situations may be.

Pope Francis, chose the theme "You shall be my witnesses to the ends of the earth" for the 2022 World Mission Day, while reflecting on the words spoken by the Risen Jesus to his disciples just before his Ascension into heaven, as we learn from the Acts of the Apostles: "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth".

The Church, according to Vatican Council II, is "missionary" in her very nature because her founder, Jesus Christ, was the first missionary. God the Father sent God the Son into the world incarnate in Jesus of Nazareth, His Christ, with a message. This message, called the Gospel or the *Good News*, is explicitly stated in Jn. 3:16: "For God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not die, but have eternal life."

So, we can accomplish our missionary calling, by living a truly Christian life, a life filled with love, mercy, kindness, compassion, prayer, and a forgiving spirit. As Mr. Gandhi used to say: "My life is my message." Secondly by Prayer and thirdly, by our financial support, for all missionary efforts also require financial support.

Domingo Mundial de las Misiones

Más de mil millones de católicos en todo el mundo celebran hoy el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. Esta celebración anual fue instituida hace 96 años en 1926 por decreto papal del Papa Pío XI. Cada año desde entonces, la Iglesia universal ha dedicado el mes de octubre a la reflexión y oración por las misiones. En el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, los católicos se reúnen para celebrar la Eucaristía y contribuir a una colecta para el trabajo de evangelización en todo el mundo. Esta celebración anual nos da la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre la importancia del trabajo misionero para la vida de la Iglesia. Nos recuerda que somos uno con la Iglesia en todo el mundo y que todos estamos comprometidos a llevar a cabo la misión de Cristo, por diferentes que sean nuestras situaciones.

El Papa Francisco, eligió el tema "Seréis mis testigos hasta los confines de la tierra" para la Jornada Mundial de las Misiones 2022, mientras reflexionaba sobre las palabras pronunciadas por el Resucitado Jesús a sus discípulos justo antes de su Ascensión al cielo, como aprendemos de los Hechos de los Apóstoles: "Recibiréis poder cuando haya venido sobre vosotros el Espíritu Santo; y seréis mis testigos en Jerusalén, en toda Judea, en Samaria y hasta los confines de la tierra".

La Iglesia, según el Concilio Vaticano II, es "misionera" en su misma naturaleza porque su fundador, Jesucristo, fue el primer misionero. Dios Padre envió a Dios Hijo al mundo encarnado en Jesús de Nazaret, Su Cristo, con un mensaje. Este mensaje, llamado Evangelio o Buena Nueva, está explícitamente declarado en Jn. 3:16: "Porque tanto amó Dios al mundo que dio a su Hijo unigénito, para que todo el que cree en él no muera, sino que tenga vida eterna".

Entonces, podemos cumplir con nuestro llamado misionero al vivir una vida verdaderamente cristiana, una vida llena de amor, misericordia, bondad, compasión, oración y un espíritu de perdón. Como solía decir el Sr. Gandhi: "Mi vida es mi mensaje". En segundo lugar, por la oración y, en tercer lugar, por nuestro apoyo financiero, porque todos los esfuerzos misioneros también requieren apoyo financiero.
