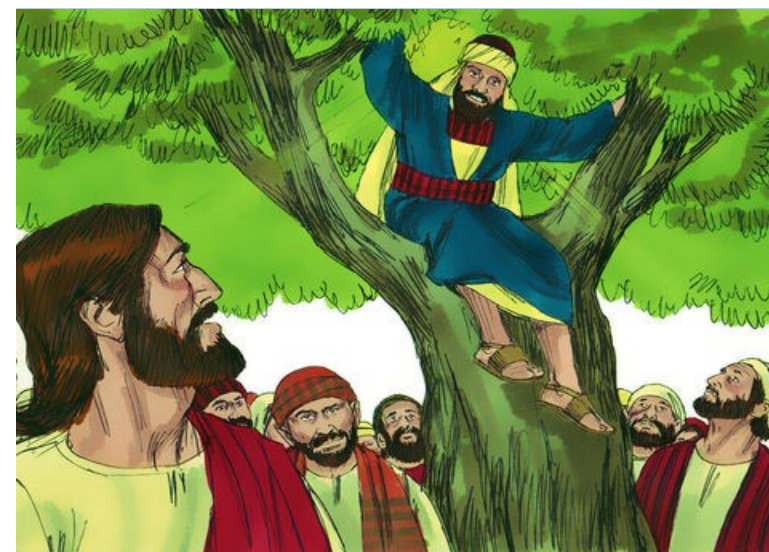

### Why do Catholics honor and venerate saints?

All Saints' Day is a universal Christian feast honoring all Christian saints, known and unknown, who are now with God in glory. "Halloween" celebrated on the eve of the Day of All Saints, got its name from "All Hallows' Eve" or the Vigil of All Saints Day. This is a day on which we thank God for giving ordinary men and women a share in His holiness and heavenly glory as a reward for their faith. Besides, the feast is observed in order to teach us to honor the saints, both by imitating their lives and by seeking their intercession for us before Christ, the only mediator between God and man (I Tim. 2/5).

Reasons why we honor saints: 1- The saints put their trust in Christ and lived heroic lives of faith. St. Paul asks us to serve and honor such noble souls. 2- The saints are our role-models. They teach us by their lives that Christ's holy life of love, mercy, and unconditional forgiveness can be lived by ordinary people of all walks of life and at all times. 3 – The saints are our heavenly mediators who intercede for us before Jesus, the only mediator between God and us. (James: 5/16-18, Exodus: 32/13, Jer. 15:1, Revel. 8:3-4,) 4- The saints are the instruments that God uses to work miracles at present, just as He used the rod of Moses (Exodus), the bones of the dead prophet, Elisha (II Kings 13/21), the towel of Paul (Acts: 19/12) and the shadow of Peter (Acts 5/15) to work miracles in earlier times. On the feast of All Saints the church invites us and challenges us to walk the walk of the saints and not just talk the talk: "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven" (Matthew 7:21). St. Augustine challenges us: "If he and she can become saints, why can't I?"

This year All saint's day falls on Tuesday and it will be a Holy Day of Obligation, meaning that one of the requirements is to attend Mass. Mass at St. Timothy will be celebrated at 12:00 noon.

¿Por qué los católicos honran y veneran a los santos?

El Día de Todos los Santos es una fiesta cristiana universal que honra a todos los santos cristianos, conocidos y desconocidos, que ahora están con Dios en la gloria. "Halloween" que se celebra en la víspera del Día de Todos los Santos, obtuvo su nombre de "All Hallows' Eve" o la Vigilia del Día de Todos los Santos. Este es un día en el que damos gracias a Dios por dar a hombres y mujeres comunes una parte de Su santidad y gloria celestial como recompensa por su fe. Además, la fiesta se observa para enseñarnos a honrar a los santos, tanto imitando su vida como buscando su intercesión por nosotros ante Cristo, el único mediador entre Dios y los hombres (1 Tim. 2/5).

Razones por las que honramos a los santos: 1- Los santos pusieron su confianza en Cristo y vivieron vidas heroicas de fe. San Pablo nos pide que sirvamos y honremos a tan nobles almas. 2- Los santos son nuestros modelos a seguir. Nos enseñan con sus vidas que la vida santa de amor, misericordia y perdón incondicional de Cristo puede ser vivida por personas comunes de todos los ámbitos de la vida y en todo momento. 3 – Los santos son nuestros mediadores celestiales que interceden por nosotros ante Jesús, el único mediador entre Dios y nosotros. (Santiago: 5/16-18, Éxodo: 32/13, Jer. 15:1, Apoc. 8:3-4,) 4- Los santos son los instrumentos que Dios usa para obrar milagros en la actualidad, tal como lo hizo la vara de Moisés (Éxodo), los huesos del profeta muerto, Eliseo (II Reyes 13/21), la toalla de Pablo (Hechos: 19/12) y la sombra de Pedro (Hechos 5/15) para obrar milagros en tiempos anteriores. En la fiesta de Todos los Santos, la iglesia nos invita y nos desafía a caminar el camino de los santos y no solo hablar por hablar: "No todo el que me dice: 'Señor, Señor', entrará en el reino de los cielos, pero solo el que hace la voluntad de mi Padre que está en los cielos" (Mateo 7:21). San Agustín nos desafía: "Si él y ella pueden llegar a ser santos, ¿por qué yo no?".

Este año Todos los Santos cae en martes y será un día de precepto, es decir, uno de los requisitos es asistir a misa. La misa en San Timoteo se celebrará a las 12:00 del mediodía.
