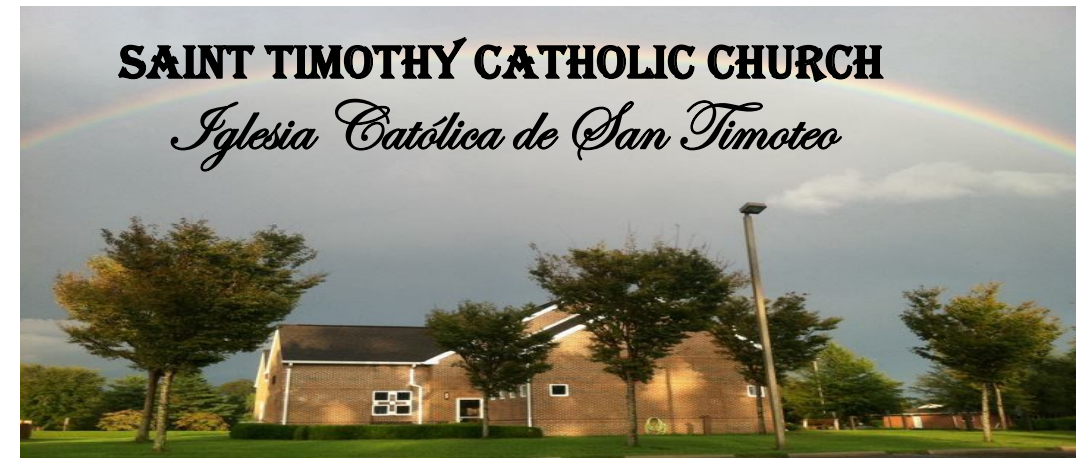

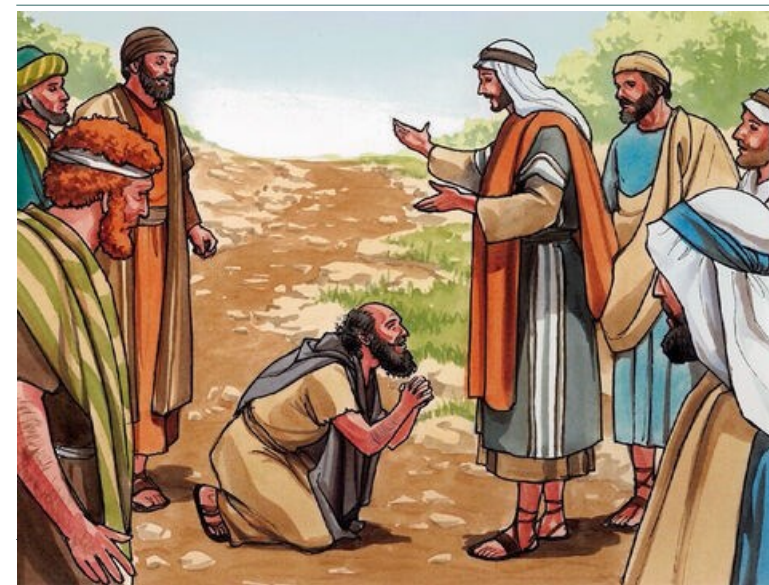

October: The Month of the Holy Rosary

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The feast was introduced by Pope St. Pius V (1504-1572) in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The pope attributed more to the "arms" of the Rosary than the power of cannons and the valor of the soldiers who fought there.

Legend tells us that the Rosary as a form of prayer was given to St. Dominic (1170-1221) by Mary, the Mother of Our Lord, who entrusted it to him as an aid in the conflicts with the Albigensians. The Dominican pope, St. Pius V, did much to further the spread of the Rosary and it thereafter became one of the most popular devotions in Christendom. It was the same Pope St. Pius V, who in 1569 officially approved the Rosary in its present form with the Papal Bull, *Consueverunt Romani Pontifices*. It had been completed by the addition of the second half of the "Hail Mary" and the "Glory be to the Father" at the conclusion of each mystery.

Many other popes have contributed to help increase devotion to the Rosary by their writings. Pope Paul VI (papacy: 1963-1978) devoted the last section of his Apostolic Exhortation *MARIALIS CULTUS* to the Angelus and the Rosary (MC 40-55). In this document, he wrote that "the Rosary retains an unaltered value and intact freshness." (MC, 41)

The Rosary is primarily a scriptural prayer. This can be summarized by the traditional phrase used by Pope Pius XII (papacy: 1939-1958) that the Rosary is "a compendium of the entire Gospel" (AAS 38 [1946] p. 419). The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centered on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption.

John Paul II called the Rosary his favorite prayer, in which we meditate with Mary upon the mysteries which she as a mother meditated on in her heart (Lk. 2:19) (*Osservatore Romano*, 44; 30 Oct. 1979).

In this month of October, let us consider this beautiful prayer of the Rosary as a means that we too can use in order to draw closer to Jesus and Mary by meditating on the great mysteries of our salvation.

Lastly, I invite you to come on Friday 10/14 at 10am for our Annual Rosary Rally in front of the Old Church Building.

Octubre: El Mes del Santo Rosario

El mes de octubre de cada año está dedicado al Santísimo Rosario. Esto se debe principalmente al hecho de que la fiesta litúrgica de Nuestra Señora del Rosario se celebra anualmente el 7 de octubre. Fue instituido para honrar a la Santísima Virgen María en agradecimiento por la protección que ella da a la Iglesia en respuesta al rezo del Rosario por parte de los fieles.

La fiesta fue introducida por el Papa San Pío V (1504-1572) en el año 1571 para conmemorar la milagrosa victoria de las fuerzas cristianas en la Batalla de Lepanto el 7 de octubre de 1571. El Papa atribuyó más a las "armas" del Rosario que al poder de los cañones y al valor de los soldados que lucharon allí.

La leyenda nos dice que el Rosario como forma de oración fue entregado a Santo Domingo (1170-1221) por María, la Madre de Nuestro Señor, quien se lo confió como ayuda en los conflictos con los albigenses. El Papa dominico, San Pío V, hizo mucho para promover la difusión del Rosario y a partir de entonces se convirtió en una de las devociones más populares en la cristiandad. Fue el mismo Papa San Pío V, quien en 1569 aprobó oficialmente el Rosario en su forma actual con la Bula Papal, *Consueverunt Romani Pontifices*. Se había completado con la adición de la segunda mitad del "Ave María" y la "Gloria al Padre" al final de cada misterio.

Muchos otros papas han contribuido a ayudar a aumentar la devoción al Rosario con sus escritos. El Papa Pablo VI (papado: 1963-1978) dedicó la última sección de su Exhortación Apostólica *MARIALIS CULTUS* al Ángelus y al Rosario (MC 40-55). En este documento, escribió que "el Rosario conserva un valor inalterado y una frescura intacta". (MC, 41)

El Rosario es principalmente una oración bíblica. Esto se puede resumir en la frase tradicional utilizada por el Papa Pío XII (papado: 1939-1958) de que el Rosario es "un compendio de todo el Evangelio" (AAS 38 [1946] p. 419). El Rosario extrae sus misterios del Nuevo Testamento y se centra en los grandes acontecimientos de la Encarnación y la Redención.

Juan Pablo II llamó al Rosario su oración favorita, en la que meditamos con María sobre los misterios que ella como madre meditó en su corazón (Lc. 2:19) (*Osservatore Romano*, 44; 30 de octubre de 1979).

En este mes de octubre, consideremos esta hermosa oración del Rosario como un medio que también nosotros podemos utilizar para acercarnos a Jesús y a María meditando en los grandes misterios de nuestra salvación.

Por último, los invito a todos este viernes 10/14 a las 10 am para nuestro Rally Anual del Rosario frente al Edificio de la Iglesia Vieja.
