




Happy Thanksgiving

This Thursday as you gather around your thanksgiving table, I hope that your family takes a moment to reflect upon what you are especially grateful for in your lives. As your Pastor, I am thankful for you all, for your commitment to discipleship which includes your presence, prayers, and support of our Saint Timothy Catholic Church parish family.

Thanksgiving is the most uniquely American of all our holidays. During the Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln, established Thanksgiving Day as a formal holiday on which we express our thanks to God for the many blessings He has provided. The first American Thanksgiving didn't occur in 1621 when a group of Pilgrims shared a feast with a group of friendly Indians. The first recorded public Thanksgiving had taken place in Virginia more than 11 years earlier, and it wasn't a feast. The winter of 1610 at Jamestown had reduced a group of 409 settlers to 60. The survivors had prayed for help without knowing when or how it might come. When help arrived in the form of a ship filled with food and supplies from England, a prayer meeting was held to give communal thanks to God. This makes thanksgiving the favorite holiday of many Americans because it has the simplicity of a family gathering together for a meal. We must learn to be thankful, or we will either become bitter and discouraged or grow arrogant and self-satisfied.

Thanksgiving Day also has a profound religious meaning, because giving thanks is the very heart of our natural and spiritual life. For us as Catholics, the central act of worship is called the *Eucharist*, a Greek word for *Thanksgiving*. In the Mass, we give thanks to God through Jesus, and share a sacred meal in which we acknowledge the fact that everything we have comes from God.

We give thanks especially for establishing and preserving our nation in freedom, for giving us a rich land in which to dwell, and for providing us with an abundance of the fruits of the earth. In order that we might live in peace and be good stewards of all that He provides, He grants us the grace to recognize his gifts and to live as good citizens.

May you find great joy in giving thanks to God for the blessings in your life, this thanksgiving day. Amen.

Feliz día de acción de gracias

Este jueves, mientras se reúnen alrededor de su mesa de acción de gracias, espero que su familia se tome un momento para reflexionar sobre las cosas por las que están especialmente agradecidos en sus vidas. Como su Pastor, estoy agradecido por todos ustedes, por su compromiso con el discipulado que incluye su presencia, oraciones y apoyo a nuestra familia parroquial de la Iglesia Católica de San Timoteo.

El Día de Acción de Gracias es el estadounidense más exclusivo de todos nuestros días festivos. Durante la Guerra Civil, el presidente Abraham Lincoln estableció el Día de Acción de Gracias como un feriado formal en el que expresamos nuestro agradecimiento a Dios por las muchas bendiciones que nos ha brindado. El primer Día de Acción de Gracias estadounidense no ocurrió en 1621 cuando un grupo de peregrinos compartió una fiesta con un grupo de indios amigos. El primer Día de Acción de Gracias público registrado había tenido lugar en Virginia más de 11 años antes, y no fue una fiesta. El invierno de 1610 en Jamestown había reducido un grupo de 409 colonos a 60. Los sobrevivientes habían orado pidiendo ayuda sin saber cuándo ni cómo podría llegar. Cuando llegó la ayuda en forma de un barco lleno de alimentos y suministros de Inglaterra, se llevó a cabo una reunión de oración para dar gracias comunitarias a Dios. Esto hace que el Día de Acción de Gracias sea el día festivo favorito de muchos estadounidenses porque tiene la sencillez de una reunión familiar para comer. Debemos aprender a ser agradecidos, o nos volveremos amargados y desalentados o nos volveremos arrogantes y satisfechos de nosotros mismos.

El Día de Acción de Gracias también tiene un profundo significado religioso, porque dar gracias es el corazón mismo de nuestra vida natural y espiritual. Para nosotros como católicos, el acto central de adoración se llama Eucaristía, una palabra griega para acción de gracias. En la Misa, damos gracias a Dios por medio de Jesús y compartimos una comida sagrada en la que reconocemos que todo lo que tenemos proviene de Dios.

Damos gracias especialmente por establecer y preservar nuestra nación en libertad, por darnos una tierra rica en la que morar, y por proveernos con abundancia de los frutos de la tierra. Para que podamos vivir en paz y ser buenos administradores de todo lo que Él provee, Él nos concede la gracia de reconocer sus dones y vivir como buenos ciudadanos.

Que encuentres gran alegría en dar gracias a Dios por las bendiciones en tu vida, este día de acción de gracias. Amén.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS



IN ACTION FOR CHILDREN

With the observance of World Orphans Day on Nov. 14, consider ways that Knights of Columbus carry on the mission of their founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, to protect widows and orphans, and care for the needy and outcast. In recent months, this mission can be seen especially clearly in Poland, where the Order has helped provide a home for refugee children from Ukrainian orphanages.

Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine last February, more than 100 children from the cities of Myrne and Melitopol were relocated to a retreat center outside Częstochowa, Poland. With financial assistance from the Knights of Columbus, the center has been turned into an orphanage, offering love, safety and stability to refugee children who have lost everything.

The Knights of Columbus has also stepped-up efforts to help the unborn by giving to women's shelters who take in unwed mothers and in donating ultrasound machines to clinics who are pro-life. **Giving Tuesday** is Nov. 29 this year, and the Knights are raising money for Coats for Kids to provide coats for children in need to ensure that no child goes without the gift of warmth this winter season.


