
St Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter



November and the Holy Souls in Purgatory



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The month of November is dedicated in a special way to the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise."

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." We know that a defiled soul cannot enter into heaven. According to the book of Revelation 21:27: "nothing unclean shall enter Heaven." Holy Scripture (Proverbs 24:16) also teaches that even "the just sin seven times a day." Since it would be contrary to the mercy of God to punish such souls with venial sins in Hell, they are seen as entering a place or state of purification, called Purgatory, which combines God's justice with His mercy.

Purgatory is not, as many people think, "one last trial". The Church's official teaching on Purgatory is plain and simple. There is a place or state of purification called Purgatory, where souls undergoing purification can be helped by the prayers of the faithful (Council of Trent). Some modern theologians suggest that the fire of Purgatory is an intense, transforming encounter with Jesus Christ and his fire of love. They also speak of Purgatory as an "instant" purification immediately after death, varying in intensity from soul to soul, depending on the state of each individual. The Catechism of the Catholic Church recommends that we can help the "holy souls" by praying for them in conjunction with the offering of the Eucharistic Sacrifice and also encourages "almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead" (CCC #1032).

Let us not forget to pray for our dear departed, have Masses offered for them, visit their graves, and make daily sacrifices for them. God can foresee and apply the merits of our prayers, penances and works of charity, done even years after their death, for our departed dear ones, in favor of our deceased dear ones, at the moment of their deaths.

May the Souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in Eternal Peace, Amen.

.Noviembre y las Benditas Ánimas del Purgatorio.

El mes de noviembre está dedicado de manera especial a las Benditas Ánimas del Purgatorio. La Iglesia recuerda a todos sus hijos fieles que han partido de esta vida, pero que aún no han alcanzado los gozos del cielo. San Pablo nos advierte que no debemos ignorar a los muertos, ni afligirnos, "como los demás que no tienen esperanza... Porque el Señor mismo descenderá del cielo... y los muertos que están en Cristo resucitarán". .

La Iglesia siempre nos ha enseñado a orar por los que se han ido a la eternidad. Incluso en el Antiguo Testamento se ofrecieron oraciones y limosnas por las almas de los muertos por aquellos que pensaban "bien y religiosamente acerca de la resurrección". Se creía que "a los que se habían dormido con la piedad se les reservaba una gran gracia" y que "es, por lo tanto, un pensamiento santo y saludable orar por los muertos, para que sean libres de los pecados". Sabemos que un alma contaminada no puede entrar en el cielo. Según el libro de Apocalipsis 21:27: "nada inmundo entrará en el cielo". La Sagrada Escritura (Proverbios 24:16) también enseña que incluso "el justo peca siete veces al día". Dado que sería contrario a la misericordia de Dios castigar a tales almas con pecados veniales en el Infierno, se las ve entrando en un lugar o estado de purificación, llamado Purgatorio, que combina la justicia de Dios con Su misericordia.

El purgatorio no es, como mucha gente piensa, "una última prueba". La enseñanza oficial de la Iglesia sobre el Purgatorio es clara y sencilla. Existe un lugar o estado de purificación llamado Purgatorio, donde las almas en proceso de purificación pueden ser ayudadas por las oraciones de los fieles (Concilio de Trento). Algunos teólogos modernos sugieren que el fuego del Purgatorio es un encuentro intenso y transformador con Jesucristo y su fuego de amor. También hablan del Purgatorio como una purificación "instantánea" inmediatamente después de la muerte, variando en intensidad de alma a alma, según el estado de cada individuo. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica recomienda que podemos ayudar a las "almas santas" rezando por ellas junto con la ofrenda del Sacrificio Eucarístico y también anima a "las limosnas, las indulgencias y las obras de penitencia realizadas en favor de los difuntos" (CIC #1032).

No olvidemos orar por nuestros queridos difuntos, ofrecer misas por ellos, visitar sus tumbas y hacer sacrificios diarios por ellos. Dios puede prever y aplicar los méritos de nuestras oraciones, penitencias y obras de caridad, realizadas incluso años después de su muerte, por nuestros seres queridos difuntos, a favor de nuestros seres queridos difuntos, en el momento de su muerte.

Que las Almas de los fieles difuntos por la misericordia de Dios descansen en la Paz Eterna, Amén.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The history of the Knights of Columbus begins with its founding in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney at St. Mary s Parish in New Haven, Connecticut. The order was designed to foster members' pride in both their Catholic and American heritages and to establish standards of behavior for Catholic gentlemen. The Knights of Columbus Council had three degrees, standing for Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. There are now over 2 million Knights of Columbus worldwide.

In 1900 the Knights of Columbus decided to add a fourth degree to become their Patriotic Degree. On February 22, 1900, the first Fourth Degree Exemplification was held in New York City, on that date 1383 Catholic gentlemen were inducted into the degree.

On Saturday October 29, 2022, a Fourth Degree Exemplification was held in Manassas, Virginia. 71 Catholic Gentlemen were inducted into the Fourth Degree on that date, including Saint Timothy's own Joshua Shaefer. Congratulations to our new Sir Knight Joshua.
