
St Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

March for Life

As we count down to Christmas festivities, I want to bring to your awareness of this upcoming event. The March for Life will again happen on Friday, January 20, 2023 in Washington DC! Even with the wonderful blessing of *Roe v. Wade* being overturned, which allows more freedom at the state level to enact pro-life laws, the necessary work to build a culture of life in the United States of America is not finished. Our most important work is changing hearts and minds. The goal of the national March for Life is to not only change laws at the state and federal level, but to change the culture to ultimately make abortion unthinkable. Protecting the life of the unborn children is the pre-eminent human rights issue of our time, not only because of the sheer magnitude of the numbers, but because abortion attacks the sanctuary of life, and the family.

Here at St. Timothy, we will have a commercial bus (with restroom) departing that morning, with a stop at Warsaw Food Lion taking you to the Washington DC Mall for the March and after a dinner at Golden Corral returning that evening to your respective destination. You will need to dress warmly and wear good walking shoes. There is no charge for travel but will need to pack a lunch to eat on the bus prior to the March events which start at 1pm, Water and light snacks are provided on bus. You will be responsible for the cost for the Golden Corral dinner.
