
St Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

Importance of human life from conception to natural death

It is a medical fact that human lives begin at conception as taught in all medical and nursing schools. From this scientific consensus about when and how human life begins, it follows that we should all respect human life from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death. Catholic theology teaches that a soul enters a human body at the moment of its conception. Hence, all types of abortion kill human persons. As our Holy Father puts it, the first right that everybody has is "the inviolable right of every innocent being to life" (Donum Vitae). "All human beings, from their mother's womb, belong to God who searches them and knows them, who forms them and knits them together with his own hands, who gazes on them when they are tiny shapeless embryos and already sees in them the adults of tomorrow..." (Pope John Paul II's 1995Pro-life Encyclical The Gospel of Life - "Evangelium Vitae."). The pro-life teachings of the Catholic Church are not based only on sacred Scripture in which God reveals to us the divine creation and the divine destiny of human life. They are also based upon what is commonly called "natural law," the divine law written in our hearts and knowable by human reason. "From the time that the ovum is fertilized, a life is begun which is neither that of the father nor the mother; it is rather the life of a new human being with his own growth...Modern genetic science offers clear confirmation. It has demonstrated that from the first instant there is established the program of what this living being will be".

Scripture and tradition of the Church teaches us that human life is sacred because from its beginning it involves "the creative action of God." "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you" (Jer 1:5) Hence, the life of every individual, from its very beginning, is part of God's plan. Vatican II Council, forcefully condemned a number of crimes and attacks against human life: "Whatever is opposed to life itself, such as any type of murder, genocide, abortion, euthanasia, or willful self-destruction, whatever violates the integrity of the human person, such as mutilation, torments inflicted on body or mind, attempts to coerce the will itself; whatever insults human dignity, such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children; as well as disgraceful working conditions, where people are treated as mere instruments of gain rather than as free and responsible persons; all these things and others like them are infamies indeed.

Importancia de la vida humana desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural

Es un hecho médico que la vida humana comienza en la concepción como se enseña en todas las escuelas de medicina y enfermería. De este consenso científico sobre cuándo y cómo comienza la vida humana, se deduce que todos debemos respetar la vida humana desde el momento de la concepción hasta el momento de la muerte natural. La teología católica enseña que un alma entra en un cuerpo humano en el momento de su concepción. Por lo tanto, todos los tipos de aborto matan personas humanas. Como dice nuestro Santo Padre, el primer derecho que tiene toda persona es "el derecho inviolable de todo ser inocente a la vida" (Donum Vitae). "Todos los seres humanos, desde el seno de su madre, pertenecen a Dios que los busca y los conoce, que los forma y entreteje con sus propias manos, que los mira cuando son minúsculos embriones informes y ve ya en ellos a los adultos de mañana..." (Encíclica Pro-vida del Papa Juan Pablo II de 1995 El Evangelio de la Vida - "Evangelium Vitae"). Las enseñanzas pro-vida de la Iglesia Católica no se basan únicamente en la Sagrada Escritura en la que Dios nos revela la creación divina y el destino divino de la vida humana. También se basan en lo que comúnmente se llama "ley natural", la ley divina escrita en nuestros corazones y conocida por la razón humana. "Desde el momento en que el óvulo es fecundado, se inicia una vida que no es ni la del padre ni la de la madre, es más bien la vida de un nuevo ser humano con su propio crecimiento... La ciencia genética moderna ofrece una clara confirmación. ha demostrado que desde el primer instante está establecido el programa de lo que será este ser vivo".

La Escritura y la tradición de la Iglesia nos enseña que la vida humana es sagrada porque desde su comienzo implica "la acción creadora de Dios". "Antes de formarte en el vientre te conocí, y antes de que nacieras te santifiqué" (Jer 1,5). Por tanto, la vida de cada individuo, desde su mismo comienzo, forma parte del plan de Dios. El Concilio Vaticano II, condenó enérgicamente una serie de crímenes y atentados contra la vida humana: "Todo lo que se oponga a la vida misma, como cualquier tipo de asesinato, genocidio, aborto, eutanasia o autodestrucción voluntaria, todo lo que atente contra la integridad del ser humano persona, como la mutilación, los tormentos infligidos en el cuerpo o la mente, los intentos de coaccionar la voluntad misma; todo lo que atente contra la dignidad humana, como las condiciones de vida infrahumanas, el encarcelamiento arbitrario, la deportación, la esclavitud, la prostitución, la venta de mujeres y niños; así como condiciones de trabajo vergonzosas, donde las personas son tratadas como meros instrumentos de lucro y no como personas libres y responsables; todas estas cosas y otras semejantes son infamias en verdad.


