What does the Knights of Columbus Charity Efforts look like?

We see what the Knights of Columbus do locally, hosting Fish Fry's in Lent, purchasing Bibles, Crucifixes and Rosaries for First Communion and Confirmation candidates, assisting with repairing and maintenance of the Church campus, and helping parish families in need. But local Knights also participate in National and worldwide Charity efforts. Some examples of what the Knights have done Nationally are:

- 1. Donating more than \$100 million a year to Catholic and charitable causes.
- 2. Providing tens of millions of dollars in scholarships to men and women pursuing a religious life.
- 3. Providing coats for kids and food for families.
- 4. Pro-life activities such as helping to fund the March for Life efforts and providing Wheelchairs for those in need. The Knights of Columbus have provided over \$1.8 million dollars to help furnish Women's Centers with 3D/4D ultrasound machines that have helped save hundreds of thousands of babies' lives.


