



Apostolic (Sacred) Tradition as a Source of Catholic Faith (Continued from 6/25/2023)

The Catholic and the Protestant views: Our Protestant brothers and sisters, based on 2 Timothy 3:16, "All scripture is inspired by God and profitable (useful) [Martin Luther deliberately translated it as 'sufficient'] for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work," argue that the Bible alone is intended by God to be the source of doctrinal truth, and its interpretation is left to the individual Christian. The Catholic Church, however, teaches that "Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture make up a single sacred deposit of the Word of God ... " (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 97), and that Christ established a living teaching authority (Magisterium) to safeguard the integrity of the gospel message, and to apply it with divine authority to succeeding ages. The Catholic Church explains that:

a."The Apostles left bishops as their successors and gave them their own position of teaching authority" (CCC

b."This living transmission, accomplished through the Holy Spirit, is called Sacred Tradition..." (CCC 78). c."Both Scripture and Tradition must be accepted and honored with equal sentiments of devotion and reverence" (CCC 82).

Since the Catholic doctrines on the veneration of Mary, her Immaculate Conception and her bodily Assumption into heaven, Transubstantiation at Holy Mass, praying to saints, the auricular confession, purgatory, etc., are derived from Sacred tradition, Protestants don't accept them. The truth is that the Bible supports Sacred Tradition where Tradition supports the teachings of the apostles (2 Thessalonians 2:15), and is consistent with biblical revelation. Jesus insists that Sacred Tradition should not "transgress the commands of God" (Matthew 15:3). In other words, it should be in harmony with biblical teaching and not opposed to it in any way. Though the Catholic Church officially states that Sacred Tradition should not and does not contradict Scripture, Protestants accuse Catholics of following doctrines based on tradition, without any foundation in the Scripture. Interestingly, Protestants today accept the Catholic "Tradition" of 27 books of the New Testament as divinely inspired. Protestants also accept the Catholic Tradition of meeting in the churches for worship on Sunday, rather than the Jewish custom of meeting on Saturday.

Los puntos de vista católicos y protestantes: Nuestros hermanos y hermanas protestantes, basados en 2 Timoteo 3:16, "Toda la Escritura es inspirada por Dios y provechosa (útil) [Martín Lutero la tradujo deliberadamente como 'suficiente'] para enseñar, para redargüir, para corregir e instruir en justicia, a fin de que el hombre de Dios sea perfecto, equipado para toda buena obra", argumentan que la Biblia es la única fuente de verdad doctrinal de Dios, y su interpretación se deja al individuo. Cristiano. La Iglesia Católica, sin embargo, enseña que "La Sagrada Tradición y la Sagrada Escritura constituyen un único depósito sagrado de la Palabra de Dios..." (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, párrafo 97), y que Cristo estableció una autoridad docente viva (*Magisterio*) para salvaguardar la integridad del mensaje del evangelio y aplicarlo con autoridad divina a las edades venideras. La Iglesia Católica explica que:

a)"Los Apóstoles dejaron a los obispos como sus sucesores y les dieron su propia posición de autoridad docente" (CIC 77).

b)"Esta transmisión viva, realizada por el Espíritu Santo, se llama Sagrada Tradición..." (CIC 78). c)"Tanto la Escritura como la Tradición deben ser acogidas y honradas con iguales sentimientos de devoción y reverencia" (CIC 82).

Dado que las doctrinas católicas sobre la veneración de María, su Inmaculada Concepción y su Asunción corporal al cielo, la Transubstanciación en la Santa Misa, la oración a los santos, la confesión auricular, el purgatorio, etc. se derivan de la Sagrada tradición, los protestantes no las aceptan. La verdad es que la Biblia apoya la Sagrada Tradición donde la Tradición apoya las enseñanzas de los apóstoles (2 Tesalonicenses 2:15), y es consistente con la revelación bíblica. Jesús insiste en que la Sagrada Tradición no debe "transgredir los mandamientos de Dios" (Mateo 15:3). En otras palabras, debe estar en armonía con la enseñanza bíblica y no oponerse a ella de ninguna manera. Aunque la Iglesia Católica declara oficialmente que la Sagrada Tradición no debe y no contradice las Escrituras, los protestantes acusan a los católicos de seguir doctrinas basadas en la tradición, sin ningún fundamento en las Escrituras. Curiosamente, los protestantes de hoy aceptan la "Tradición" católica de 27 libros del Nuevo Testamento como divinamente inspirados. Los protestantes también aceptan la tradición católica de reunirse en las iglesias para adorar el domingo, en lugar de la costumbre judía de reunirse el sábado.

bulbs. This allowed the church to be well lighted and save money on energy. The original lights in the church consumed over 18,000 watts per hour, the new LED lights consume only 1000 watts per hour. This means the cost of lighting the church has been reduced to approximately 12 cents per hour. The lights were donated by a concerned parishioner.

The Knights cooked and served lunch to the children and teachers at the Vacation Bible School. Hamburgers, hot dogs, chips, and drinks were enjoyed by all. The participants were also treated to cookies and watermelon for dessert.

The Knights also replaced the weathered sign on the old church/office. It is now bright and readable, like the other signs around the campus that the Knights replaced earlier.




Pantry Sunday

	Day 3 Nazareth, Cana Start the day in Nazareth at the Basilica of the Annunciation where we will celebrate a Mass. Walk to the Church of St. Joseph's workshop. Continue to the site where Jesus performed His first Miracle, Cana, where the married couples would renew their wedding rows at the wedding church. In the afternoon, climb Mt. Tabor, site of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Experience the views where Peter, James and John saw the Glorified Lord with Moses and Elijah.
	Day 4 Tiberias, Sea of Galilee, Mount of Beatitudes On this day, we will start with a visit to the Mount of Beatitudes, where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount. Continue to Tabgha for a visit to the church of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fish. Take a memorable boat ride across the same lake Jesus walked, the Sea of Galilee. After Lunch, visit the Church of Peter's Primacy where Peter declares his love for Jesus three times. Continue to Capernaum the home town of Jesus to see the ruins of the ancient synagogue and St. Peter's house.
	Day 5 Caesarea Maritima, Haifa After Breakfast, we drive to Caesarea, capital of the Roman province, where we visit the Roman and Crusader remains and the harbor from which St. Paul was taken prisoner to Rome. Continue to Haifa where we visit Mount Carmel and Cave of Elijah. Engly panoramic views of the Mediterranean Sea and Haifa City including the Baha'i Shrine and gardens. Drive to Bethlehem, check in to your hotel and gather for dinner.
	Day 6 Bethlehem, Shepherd's Field, Ein Karem Start our day in Bethlehem at the Church of the Nativity where we will celebrate a Mass. Visit the cave - the birthplace of Jesus- beneath the church. After lunch, drive to the town of Beit Sahour where we find the Shepherd's Fields to see the place where the Shepherd's saw the star of the Nativity. Drive to Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were first discovered. We will have a dip in the Dead Sea Sulty water. Enjoy shopping in Bethlehem, buy souvenirs for you and your family. Drive back to your hotel for dinner and overnight.
	Day 08 Old City of Jerusalem Start the day very early, praying the Stations of the Cross as we walk the true way of the Cross (Via Dolorosa). Then we will visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, where Jesus was crucified, buried, and then rose again. Yiew the Convent of Zion Sitsers and visit St. Ann's Church (birthplace of the Virgin Mary).
Day 09 Wi	estern Wall, Mt. Zion, Mt of Olives, Gethsemane Drive to the Mount of Olives for a wonderful view of Jerusalem. Visit Pater Noster Church where the lord's prayer "Our Father" was first taught. Walk the Palm Sunday way. At the foot of the mountain, see the Garden of Gethsemane with its ancient olive trees and the Church of All Nations (with the rock where Jesus prayed in agony). Visit the Walling (or Western) Wall, with views of the Al-Aksa Mosque and Dome of the Rock. See the site known as David's memorial. Visit the Caenaculumn, the place where the Last Supper occurred as well as the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Peter denied Jesus.
~	Day 10 Return to USA Today our Holy Land pilgrimage comes to an end. We will head to the airport for our return flight, carrying all these unforgettable memories walking in the footsteps of Jesus.
