
# St Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

## The Solemnity of Corpus Christi and Blessed Imelda

This celebration of the Body and Blood of the Lord originated in the Diocese of Liege in 1246 as the feast of Corpus Christi. In the reforms of Vatican II, Corpus Christi was joined with the feast of the Precious Blood (July 1) to become the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord. We celebrate today Christ's gift of the Eucharist, the source and summit of our life together as the Church. The Council of Trent (1545 to 1563) declared that we must honor Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist publicly so that those who observed the Faith of Catholics in the Most Holy Eucharist might be attracted to the Eucharistic Lord and believe in the Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, present in this great Sacrament.

Let me reflect on Blessed Imelda Lambertini (1322-1333) who offers a charming study in child sanctity. It was on the occasion of her fifth birthday that Imelda asked her pious parents if she also could receive communion. She already possessed a love of Christ, but she was far too young. With an understanding of what communion really means, she wondered aloud: "Tell me, can anyone receive Jesus into his heart and not die?"

At the early age of nine she entered the Dominican convent near Bologna. The one great desire of her life in those days was to receive within her breast her sacramental God. Custom had established the age of twelve as the proper time for little ones to receive First Holy Communion, and the convent chaplain would not listen to a suggested deviation from this rule. Frequently did the child beseech her confessor for permission to approach the divine banquet table, only to be denied. On May the 12th, 1333, the Vigil of the Ascension, the community partook of the Eucharist in a body, leaving Imelda alone in her choir stall. Her frail body shook with emotion, tears flowed down her babe-like face, and with a voice that trembled with grief she asked to be fed upon the Body of her Lord. No attention was paid to her. The Mass came to a close. The religious left the choir. But Imelda remained behind uncomforted.

Suddenly a sweet fragrance, as of roses, filled the air and was seemingly wafted throughout the monastery. The nuns, tracing its source, returned to the chapel, and there, to their astonishment, beheld a Sacred Host suspended in the air above the head of the weeping maiden. The priest who had just celebrated Mass came, paten in hand, and, with holy impatience, awaited developments. The Host slowly descended, rested on the paten, and from the hands of the chaplain Imelda received her Eucharistic God.

The transport of love which took possession of her little heart at this longed-for moment was too great for a finite being. Imelda died in the state of ecstasy in sheer joy and made her thanksgiving for First Holy Communion among the angels in Heaven. Blessed Imelda's body is incorrupt, and you can still see it today in the Church where she is interred, in Bologna. She is the patron saint of First Holy Communicants.

Let us long to always be with Jesus in the sacraments, just like Blessed Imelda, most especially when we feel that we are down.

# **DEL PASTOR**

## La Solemnidad del Corpus Christi y la Beata Imelda

Esta celebración del Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor se originó en la Diócesis de Lieja en 1246 como la fiesta del Corpus Christi. En las reformas del Vaticano II, el Corpus Christi se unió a la fiesta de la Preciosa Sangre (1 de Julio) para convertirse en la Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor. Celebramos hoy el don de Cristo de la Eucaristía, fuente y cumbre de nuestra vida común como Iglesia. El Concilio de Trento (1545 a 1563) declaró que debemos honrar a Nuestro Señor Jesucristo en la Sagrada Eucaristía públicamente para que aquellos que observan la Fe de los Católicos en la Santísima Eucaristía puedan ser atraídos al Señor Eucarístico y crean en la Divinidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, presente en este gran Sacramento.

Permítanme reflexionar sobre la beata Imelda Lambertini (1322-1333) que ofrece un encantador estudio sobre la santidad infantil. Fue con motivo de su quinto cumpleaños que Imelda preguntó a sus piadosos padres si ella también podía recibir la comunión. Ella ya poseía un amor por Cristo, pero era demasiado joven. Con una comprensión de lo que realmente significa la comunión, se preguntó en voz alta: "Dime, ¿puede alguien recibir a Jesús en su corazón y no morir?"

A la temprana edad de nueve años ingresó en el convento de los dominicos cerca de Bolonia. El único gran deseo de su vida en aquellos días era recibir en su seno a su Dios sacramental. La costumbre había establecido la edad de doce años como el momento adecuado para que los pequeños recibieran la Primera Comunión, y el capellán del convento no quiso escuchar una desviación sugerida de esta regla. Con frecuencia la niña suplicaba a su confesor permiso para acercarse a la mesa del banquete divino, solo para ser negado. El 12 de Mayo de 1333, Vigilia de la Ascensión, la comunidad participó de la Eucaristía en cuerpo, dejando a Imelda sola en su sillería. Su frágil cuerpo se estremeció de emoción, las lágrimas corrían por su rostro de bebé y con una voz que temblaba de dolor pidió ser alimentada con el Cuerpo de su Señor. No se le prestó atención. La Misa llegó a su fin. El religioso salió del coro. Pero Imelda se quedó atrás incómoda.

De repente, una dulce fragancia, como de rosas, llenó el aire y aparentemente se esparció por todo el monasterio. Las monjas, rastreando su origen, regresaron a la capilla, y allí, para su asombro, vieron una Sagrada Hostia suspendida en el aire sobre la cabeza de la doncella que lloraba. El sacerdote que acababa de celebrar la Misa llegó, patena en mano, y con santa impaciencia esperó los acontecimientos. La Hostia descendió lentamente, se posó sobre la patena y de manos del capellán Imelda recibió a su Dios Eucarístico.

El transporte de amor que se apoderó de su corazoncito en este anhelado momento fue demasiado grande para un ser finito. Imelda murió en estado de éxtasis de pura alegría e hizo su acción de gracias por la Primera Comunión entre los ángeles del Cielo. El cuerpo de la Beata Imelda está incorrupto, y aún hoy se puede ver en la Iglesia donde está enterrada, en Bolonia. Ella es la santa patrona de los Primeros Santos Comulgantes.

Anhelemos estar siempre con Jesús en los sacramentos, como la Beata Imelda, sobre todo cuando nos sentimos deprimidos.

# **Fourth Degree and Patriotism**

The Knights of Columbus is made up of two levels, the Council Level and the Fourth Degree which is the Patriotic degree. The Fourth Degree sponsors events like placing flags on veterans' graves on Memorial and Veterans Day.
