

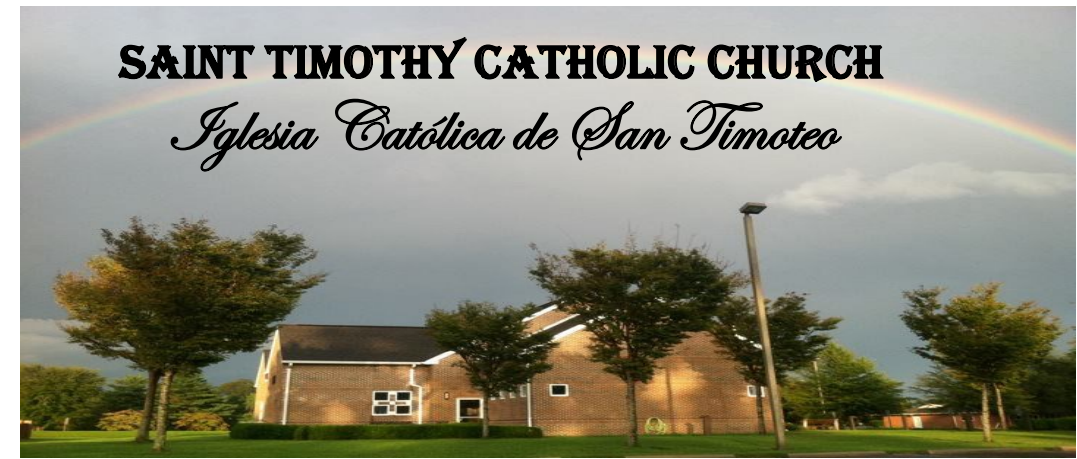

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**All Saints’ and All Souls’ Day: A Time of Mercy, Forgiveness, and Reflection**

During this time of the year, as the dead are often associated with spooky ghosts and scary poltergeists, the Catholic Church instead celebrates the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls, a time to reflect on those who have passed from this life to eternal life in Christ.

November 1 is All Saints’ Day, a Holy Day of Obligation, (check schedule for Mass times) which honors the saints in Heaven – those who have been recognized by the Church as saints, as well as those who have not been canonized. The feast was established in Rome because of the emperor’s giving of the Pantheon (the temple to all the gods) to the Church and its dedication to Saint Mary and All the Martyrs.

Then on November 2, we commemorate All Souls. Since her origins, the Church certainly prayed for the deceased faithful belonging to the early Christian communities. Whether they were martyrs or ordinary faithful who died a natural death, the community understood immediately the suffrage for the deceased as a structural dimension of their life, of their prayer and, above all, of the Eucharistic celebration. As if to signify that the profound unity with Christ and in Christ, created with Baptism, and the sharing of the Eucharist itself, lived in the Christian community, could not be severed not even with death. Moreover, thinking correctly, if Christ has overcome death, he who is reborn in Christ can no longer be separated by anything, not even by that death that Christ has already overcome! The Solemnity of All Saints in fact brings to light the truth of the communio sanctorum, of the union of all the baptized. As Pope Francis has reminded us many times: “time prevails over space.” The union in time of all the baptized, of the very first Christians up to those that will receive Baptism in the future and until the end of history, is a union that nothing will be able to affect. This union determines the journeying of the Church in time, which is a real anticipation, here on earth, of the Kingdom of Heaven. We belong to the one ecclesial Body that, uninterruptedly, from Jesus Christ, through the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Apostles, comes to us and it is for this reason that the heavenly Church is much more numerous, much more interesting, much more expert, and much more “influential” than the earthly Church.

On November 2, visiting a cemetery and having fulfilled the usual conditions (having gone to Confession, to Communion, having recited the Creed and prayed for the intentions of the Holy Father), it is possible to obtain a Plenary Indulgence, applicable to a deceased faithful. It is also possible to gain a Plenary Indulgence every other day of the year, by carrying out the various works of piety, contained in the Enchiridion Indulgentiarum (the compilation of ways in which it is possible to obtain the cancellation of the punishments due to sins), and to choose to apply it to oneself, or to a deceased faithful. The only “limitation” to this pious practice is that it can only be obtained once a day; therefore, one can gain only one [Plenary] Indulgence a day, applicable to oneself, or to a deceased faithful.

**DEL PASTOR**

**Día de Todos los Santos y de Todos los Difuntos:  
Un Tiempo de Misericordia, Perdón y Reflexión**

Durante esta época del año, como los muertos a menudo se asocian con fantasmas espeluznantes y poltergeists aterradores, la Iglesia Católica celebra las Fiestas de Todos los Santos y Todos los Difuntos, un momento para reflexionar sobre aquellos que han pasado de esta vida a la vida eterna en Cristo.

El 1 de noviembre es el Día de Todos los Santos, un día santo de precepto (consulte el horario para conocer los horarios de las misas) que honra a los santos en el cielo: aquellos que han sido reconocidos por la Iglesia como santos, así como aquellos que no han sido canonizados. La fiesta se estableció en Roma debido a la donación por parte del emperador del Panteón (el templo de todos los dioses) a la Iglesia y su dedicación a Santa María y todos los mártires.

Luego, el 2 de noviembre, conmemoramos Todos los Difuntos. Desde sus orígenes, la Iglesia ciertamente rezó por los fieles difuntos pertenecientes a las primeras comunidades cristianas. Ya fueran mártires o simples fieles que murieron de muerte natural, la comunidad comprendió inmediatamente el sufragio por los difuntos como una dimensión estructural de su vida, de su oración y, sobre todo, de la celebración eucarística. Como para significar que la unidad profunda con Cristo y en Cristo, creada con el bautismo y con la participación misma de la Eucaristía, vivida en la comunidad cristiana, no puede romperse ni siquiera con la muerte. Es más, pensando correctamente, si Cristo ha vencido a la muerte, el que renace en Cristo ya no puede ser separado de nada, ¡ni siquiera de esa muerte que Cristo ya venció! En efecto, la solemnidad de Todos los Santos pone de relieve la verdad de la comunio sanctorum, de la unión de todos los bautizados. Como nos ha recordado muchas veces el Papa Francisco: “el tiempo prevalece sobre el espacio”. La unión en el tiempo de todos los bautizados, desde los primeros cristianos hasta los que recibirán el bautismo en el futuro y hasta el fin de la historia, es una unión que nada podrá afectar. Esta unión determina el camino de la Iglesia en el tiempo, que es una auténtica anticipación, aquí en la tierra, del Reino de los Cielos. Pertenecemos al único Cuerpo eclesial que, ininterrumpidamente, desde Jesucristo, a través de la Santísima Virgen María y los Apóstoles, viene a nosotros y es por eso que la Iglesia celestial es mucho más numerosa, mucho más interesante, mucho más experta, y mucho más “influyente” que la Iglesia terrenal.

El 2 de noviembre, visitando un cementerio y habiendo cumplido las condiciones habituales (haber confesado, comulgado, haber recitado el Credo y rezado por las intenciones del Santo Padre), es posible obtener una Indulgencia Plenaria, aplicable a un difunto. fiel. También es posible obtener una Indulgencia Plenaria cada dos días del año, realizando las diversas obras de piedad, contenidas en el Enchiridion Indulgentiarum (la recopilación de las formas en que es posible obtener la cancelación de las penas debidas a los pecados), y optar por aplicarlo a uno mismo o a un fiel fallecido. La única “limitación” de esta piadosa práctica es que sólo se puede obtener una vez al día; por lo tanto, sólo se puede obtener una indulgencia [plenaria] al día, aplicable a uno mismo o a un fiel fallecido.

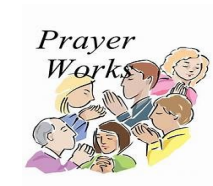
