


St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter



How Does the Magisterium Become Another Source of Authority?

Our final source of authority is the Magisterium, which is the teaching authority of the Church as an institution created by Jesus Christ and protected by the Holy Spirit. We see the Magisterium utilized for the very first time in the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 15, as we read about the Council of Jerusalem. There was a disagreement among believers on whether or not Gentiles should be circumcised upon their conversion. Jesus had not given explicit instruction on the matter, nor was there Scripture beyond the Old Testament to direct them, so some understood it to be done one way, while others understood it another way. The Apostles, who we understand to be the first bishops, got together to discuss the issue. After debating different points of view and reviewing the Scripture they had, they came to an agreement and drafted a decree on official Church teaching. Shortly before this council was the feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Church, protecting her work of salvation which, no doubt, included these first efforts of the Magisterium. The Apostles then distributed the decree to all of the other factions of the Christian Church.

We still see this practiced today, as we have throughout all of Church history. As issues and questions have come up in the Church regarding what we should do, how we should practice, what we should believe, and what Jesus intended – our bishops, cardinals, and popes have gathered under the protection of the Holy Spirit to discuss and debate God's will for His Church under the guidance of Sacred Scripture. Then decrees are drafted and then promulgated by the Pope, enabling believers to know the official teaching on the issue. This is how the doctrine and dogmas have been developed and revealed to us over the years. Believing that the Magisterium (the teaching authority and not simply the men themselves) is protected by the Holy Spirit, believers are called to give their assent to the Church teaching, whether we fully understand it or not, because it has been determined to be true and God's will.

Think of our three sources of authority as a three-legged stool. No single source is more important than any other and they all work together in a cohesive and unitive way. We should not cling to our pope more than our Scripture, nor do we ignore the beautiful smells and bells of liturgy that have been handed on to us in order to study Scripture day and night. Our Faith is dependent on all three, equally and simultaneously, which have been given to us as a gift of insurance from God, protecting the truth from our faulty human natures forever.

DEL PASTOR

¿Cómo se Convierte el Magisterio en Otra Fuente de Autoridad?

Nuestra fuente final de autoridad es el Magisterio, que es la autoridad docente de la Iglesia como institución creada por Jesucristo y protegida por el Espíritu Santo. Vemos el Magisterio utilizado por primera vez en los Hechos de los Apóstoles, Capítulo 15, cuando leemos sobre el Concilio de Jerusalén. Hubo un desacuerdo entre los creyentes sobre si los gentiles debían o no ser circuncidados al momento de su conversión. Jesús no había dado instrucciones explícitas sobre el asunto, ni había Escritura más allá del Antiguo Testamento para dirigirlos, por lo que algunos entendieron que se debía hacer de una manera, mientras que otros lo entendían de otra manera. Los Apóstoles, que entendemos fueron los primeros obispos, se reunieron para discutir el tema. Después de debatir diferentes puntos de vista y revisar las Escrituras que tenían, llegaron a un acuerdo y redactaron un decreto sobre la enseñanza oficial de la Iglesia. Poco antes de este concilio tuvo lugar la fiesta de Pentecostés, cuando el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre la Iglesia, protegiendo su obra de salvación que, sin duda, incluía estos primeros esfuerzos del Magisterio. Luego, los Apóstoles distribuyeron el decreto a todas las demás facciones de la Iglesia cristiana.

Todavía vemos que esto se practica hoy, como lo hemos hecho a lo largo de toda la historia de la Iglesia. A medida que han surgido cuestiones y preguntas en la Iglesia sobre lo que debemos hacer, cómo debemos practicar, qué debemos creer y qué pretendía Jesús, nuestros obispos, cardenales y papas se han reunido bajo la protección del Espíritu Santo para discutir y debatir la voluntad de Dios para su Iglesia bajo la guía de la Sagrada Escritura. Luego, el Papa redacta y promulga decretos que permiten a los creyentes conocer la enseñanza oficial sobre el tema. Así es como la doctrina y los dogmas se han ido desarrollando y revelando a nosotros a lo largo de los años. Creyendo que el Magisterio (la autoridad docente y no simplemente los hombres mismos) está protegido por el Espíritu Santo, los creyentes están llamados a dar su consentimiento a la enseñanza de la Iglesia, ya sea que la entendamos completamente o no, porque se ha determinado que es verdadera. y la voluntad de Dios.

Piense en nuestras tres fuentes de autoridad como un taburete de tres patas. Ninguna fuente es más importante que otra y todas trabajan juntas de manera cohesiva y unitiva. No debemos aferrarnos a nuestro Papa más que a nuestras Escrituras, ni ignorar los hermosos olores y campanas de la liturgia que nos han sido transmitidos para estudiar las Escrituras día y noche. Nuestra Fe depende de los tres, por igual y simultáneamente, que nos han sido dados como un regalo de seguridad de Dios, protegiendo la verdad de nuestra naturaleza humana defectuosa para siempre.

Protecting the Sanctity of Life

The Knights of Columbus thank all who marched in the National March for Life last week in Washington, D.C. The turnout was wonderful and as EWTN reported, there were large numbers of young people marching this year, which is encouraging.

The good news is, despite what feels like a fraught and polarized environment, there is still a consistent pro-life consensus among Americans. A new Knights of Columbus/Marist poll released this week shows that 66% of individuals support placing legal limits on abortion, while 83% of Americans support pregnancy resource centers. Also, two-thirds of Americans believe healthcare professionals with religious objections to abortions should not be legally required to perform them.

Still, there are many hearts to be changed and countless mothers who need our support. Here in Virginia we are facing these same challenges. The Knights will be helping Virginia organize their sixth annual March for Life on Wednesday, February 21, 2024. The morning will be spent talking individually with legislators, followed by a rally at 11:00am and the march which will kick off at 12:00 Noon. We urge you to consider joining your neighbors in Richmond to march for the life of the unborn.


