


St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

Holy Week is Here

The Church celebrates this Sixth Sunday in Lent as both Palm Sunday and Passion Sunday. It is on Palm Sunday that we enter Holy Week, welcoming Jesus into our lives and asking Him to allow us a share in His suffering, death, and Resurrection. Holy Week observances began in Jerusalem in the earliest days of the Church, that is between 381 and 385 AD, when devout people traveled to Jerusalem at Passover to reenact, relive, and participate in the events of the week leading up to the Resurrection. The tourists took the customs home with them. Then, Holy week observances spread to Spain by the fifth century, and to Gaul and England by the early seventh century. They didn't spread to Rome until the twelfth century. This is the time of the year when we stop to remember and relive the events that brought about our redemption and salvation.

The Holy Week liturgies present us with the actual events of the dying and rising of Jesus. These liturgies enable us to experience in our lives here and now what Jesus went through then. In other words, what we commemorate and relive during this week will not just be Jesus' dying and rising, but our own lifetime of dying and rising in Him, which result in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption. Just as Jesus did, we, too, must lay down our lives freely by actively participating in the Holy Week liturgies. In doing so, we are allowing Jesus to forgive us our sins, heal the wounds in us caused by our sins and the sins of others, and transform us more completely into the image and likeness of God. In this way, we will be able to live more fully the Divine life we received at Baptism.

Attentive participation in the Holy Week liturgies will also deepen our relationship with God, increase our Faith, and strengthen our lives as disciples of Jesus. But let us remember that Holy Week can become "holy" for us only if we actively and consciously take part in the liturgies of this week. During this week of the Passion — passionate suffering, passionate grace, passionate love, and passionate forgiving — each of us is called to remember the Christ of Calvary, and then to embrace and lighten the burden of the Christ Whose passion continues to be experienced in the hungry, the poor, the sick, the homeless, the aged, the lonely, and the outcast.

Please join us in the celebration of the liturgies of the Holy week, on the times and days as put in the bulletin on page 4.

DEL PASTOR

La Semana Santa ya está Aquí

La Iglesia celebra este sexto domingo de Cuaresma como Domingo de Ramos y Domingo de Pasión. Es el Domingo de Ramos cuando entramos en la Semana Santa, dando la bienvenida a Jesús a nuestras vidas y pidiéndole que nos permita compartir su sufrimiento, muerte y resurrección. Las celebraciones de la Semana Santa comenzaron en Jerusalén en los primeros días de la Iglesia, es decir, entre el 381 y el 385 d.C., cuando personas devotas viajaban a Jerusalén en la Pascua para recrear, revivir y participar en los eventos de la semana previa a la Resurrección. Los turistas se llevaron la aduana a casa. Luego, la observancia de la Semana Santa se extendió a España en el siglo V y a la Galia e Inglaterra a principios del siglo VII. No se extendieron a Roma hasta el siglo XII. Esta es la época del año en la que nos detenemos a recordar y revivir los acontecimientos que provocaron nuestra redención y salvación.

Las liturgias de Semana Santa nos presentan los acontecimientos reales de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús. Estas liturgias nos permiten experimentar en nuestras vidas aquí y ahora lo que Jesús vivió entonces. En otras palabras, lo que conmemoramos y revivimos durante esta semana no será solo la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, sino nuestra propia vida de muerte y resurrección en Él, que resultará en nuestra sanación, reconciliación y redención. Así como lo hizo Jesús, nosotros también debemos dar nuestra vida libremente participando activamente en las liturgias de Semana Santa. Al hacerlo, estamos permitiendo que Jesús nos perdone nuestros pecados, sane las heridas en nosotros causadas por nuestros pecados y los pecados de los demás, y nos transforme más completamente a imagen y semejanza de Dios. De esta manera podremos vivir más plenamente la vida Divina que recibimos en el Bautismo.

La participación atenta en las liturgias de Semana Santa también profundizará nuestra relación con Dios, aumentará nuestra fe y fortalecerá nuestras vidas como discípulos de Jesús. Pero recordemos que la Semana Santa puede llegar a ser "santa" para nosotros sólo si participamos activa y conscientemente en las liturgias de esta semana. Durante esta semana de la Pasión – sufrimiento apasionado, gracia apasionada, amor apasionado y perdón apasionado – cada uno de nosotros está llamado a recordar al Cristo del Calvario y luego a abrazar y aligerar la carga de Cristo cuya pasión continúa experimentándose en el los hambrientos, los pobres, los enfermos, los sin hogar, los ancianos, los solitarios y los marginados.

The Mission of Father McGivney

He wrote that the goal of forming the Knights of Columbus was to unite the men of our faith so these marginalized families could be cared for in times of sickness and need, and to help with providing a decent burial for the deceased members of these families.


