


St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

Father Gerald's Easter Message

Congratulations on a fruitful completion of the Lenten season. Christ is risen; indeed He is risen as he said, Alleluia, Alleluia! "Easter" literally means "the feast of fresh flowers." It is the greatest and the most important feast in the Church because the Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. It is the greatest of the miracles, for it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:14). "Jesus is Lord, He is risen" (Romans 10:9) was the central theme of the kerygma (or "preaching") of the Apostles.

The Resurrection of Jesus, that we celebrate today, takes us beyond the Cross to the joy and hope that comes from seeing the Risen Lord. It was Christ risen who allowed his disciples to fully know that God exists, that there is a future for every human being, and that our cry for unending life is indeed answered in Him. This is the true message of Easter!

Easter invites us, like Mary Magdalene after Jesus' Resurrection, to enter the tomb: to enter into the mystery of how God transforms our experience of despair through a vigil of love into a promise of hope. To enter into mystery means the ability to wonder, to contemplate; the ability to listen to the silence and to hear the tiny whisper amid great silence by which God speaks to us (cf. 1 Kings 19:12).

Therefore, sisters and brothers, let us live the lives of Resurrected people. We are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of our sins, evil habits, dangerous addictions, despair, discouragement, or doubts. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the living presence of the Risen Lord who loves us in all the events of our lives and amid the boredom, suffering, pain, and tensions of our day-to-day life.

DEL PASTOR

Mensaje de Pascua del Padre Gerald

Felicitaciones por una finalización fructífera de la temporada de Cuaresma. Cristo ha resucitado; de hecho, ha resucitado cuando dijo: ¡Aleluya, Aleluya! "Pascua" significa literalmente "la fiesta de las flores frescas". Es la fiesta más grande e importante de la Iglesia porque la Resurrección de Cristo es la base de nuestra fe cristiana. Es el mayor de los milagros, porque prueba que Jesús es Dios. Por eso escribe San Pablo: "Si Cristo no ha resucitado, entonces nuestra predicación es vana; y vuestra fe es vana" (1 Corintios 15:14). "Jesús es Señor, ha resucitado" (Romanos 10:9) fue el tema central del kerygma (o "predicación") de los Apóstoles.

La Resurrección de Jesús, que celebramos hoy, nos lleva más allá de la Cruz hacia la alegría y la esperanza que provienen de ver al Señor Resucitado. Fue Cristo resucitado quien permitió a sus discípulos saber plenamente que Dios existe, que hay un futuro para cada ser humano y que nuestro clamor por una vida sin fin tiene respuesta en Él. ¡Este es el verdadero mensaje de Pascua!

La Pascua nos invita, como María Magdalena después de la Resurrección de Jesús, a entrar en la tumba: a entrar en el misterio de cómo Dios transforma nuestra experiencia de desesperación a través de una vigilia de amor en una promesa de esperanza. Entrar en el misterio significa la capacidad de maravillarse, de contemplar; la capacidad de escuchar el silencio y de oír el pequeño susurro en medio del gran silencio con el que Dios nos habla (cf. 1 Reyes 19,12).

Por eso, hermanas y hermanos, vivamos la vida de los Resucitados. Se supone que no debemos permanecer sepultados en la tumba de nuestros pecados, malos hábitos, adicciones peligrosas, desesperación, desánimo o dudas. En cambio, se espera que vivamos una vida alegre y pacífica, experimentando constantemente la presencia viva del Señor Resucitado que nos ama en todos los acontecimientos de nuestras vidas y en medio del aburrimiento, el sufrimiento, el dolor y las tensiones de nuestro día a día. vida.

On Tuesday, April 2, between 11:00AM – 1:00PM, come to the Walmart parking lot on Route 360/17 for a 20-minute consultation to help you make sure your car is adjusted properly to "fit" you. This is not a driving evaluation; technicians check such things as mirror adjustments to reduce blind spots, foot positioning on pedals, seat positioning/line of sight, and head restraint adjustment. If necessary, an occupational therapist will be on hand to recommend adaptive devices.
