Why Do Catholics Keep Jesus on the Cross When He Is Risen?

Since we are still celebrating the season of Easter, I thought this would be an interesting topic to reflect on: Why we keep Jesus on the cross.

The non-Catholics claim that they serve a Risen Christ, not a bloody, suffering victim as seen on Catholic crucifixes. For them, it is a violation of the second commandment to make a graven image of Christ on the cross. The short Catholic answer is that we are saved by Jesus, and not by a cross. Hence, we adore both a suffering Christ and a risen Christ. You cannot preach a gospel which proclaims the Resurrection without the Crucifixion, or an Easter without a Good Friday. That is why Jesus challenged us: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:27). One cannot look at a crucifix without seeing Great Love. For, as Christ said, "Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Jesus came to be the Lamb of God who took away our sins through his atoning death on the cross. That is precisely why Catholics focus on a bloody, suffering victim.

That is why the Church added the figure of Christ, to remind the faithful of the great suffering that brought about their redemption. The crucifix has many advantages: It helps produce contrition for sins. It reminds us of the seriousness of and consequences of sin. It helps us in Mass to focus on the Holy Sacrifice! It comforts us in our sorrows. It inspires us to bear suffering patiently. It shows us the price Jesus paid for our salvation, and increases our gratitude towards Christ.

Como todavía estamos celebrando la temporada de Pascua, pensé que este sería un tema interesante para reflexionar: por qué mantenemos a Jesús en la cruz.

Los no Católicos afirman que sirven a un Cristo resucitado, no a una víctima sangrienta y sufriente como se ve en los crucifijos Católicos. Para ellos es una violación del mandamiento de hacer una imagen tallada de Cristo en la cruz. La respuesta católica breve es que somos salvos por Jesús y no por una cruz. Por eso adoramos tanto a un Cristo sufriente como a un Cristo resucitado. No se puede predicar un evangelio que proclame la Resurrección sin la Crucifixión, ni una Pascua sin un Viernes Santo. Por eso Jesús nos desafió: "El que no lleva su cruz y viene en pos de mí, no puede ser mi discípulo" (Lucas 14:27). No se puede mirar un crucifijo sin ver el Gran Amor. Porque, como dijo Cristo: "Nadie tiene mayor amor que este, que uno ponga su vida por sus amigos" (Juan 15:13). Jesús vino para ser el Cordero de Dios que quitó nuestros pecados mediante su muerte expiatoria en la cruz. Precisamente por eso los Católicos se centran en una víctima sangrienta y sufriente.

Por eso la Iglesia añadió la figura de Cristo, para recordar a los fieles el gran sufrimiento que supuso su redención. El crucifijo tiene muchas ventajas: Ayuda a producir contrición por los pecados. Nos recuerda la gravedad y las consecuencias del pecado. ¡Nos ayuda en la Misa a concentrarnos en el Santo Sacrificio! Nos consuela en nuestras penas. Nos inspira a soportar el sufrimiento con paciencia. Nos muestra el precio que Jesús pagó por nuestra salvación y aumenta nuestra gratitud hacia Cristo.
