


St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter



Divine Mercy Sunday

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that Feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her Diary entry 699:

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

In all, St. Faustina recorded 14 revelations from Jesus concerning His desire for this feast.

Nevertheless, Divine Mercy Sunday is NOT a feast based solely on St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not primarily about St. Faustina — nor is it altogether a new feast. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter. The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however, highlight the meaning of the day. Liturgically, the Easter Octave has always been centered on the theme of Divine Mercy and forgiveness. Divine Mercy Sunday, therefore, points us to the merciful love of God that lies behind the whole Paschal Mystery — the whole mystery of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ — made present for us in the Eucharist. In this way, it also sums up the whole Easter Octave. As Pope John Paul II pointed out in his Regina Caeli address on Divine Mercy Sunday, 1995: "the whole octave of Easter is like a single day," and the Octave Sunday is meant to be the day of "thanksgiving for the goodness God has shown to man in the whole Easter mystery."

DEL PASTOR

Domingo de la Divina Misericordia

En una serie de revelaciones a Santa María Faustina Kowalska en la década de 1930, nuestro Señor pidió que se celebrara una fiesta especial el domingo después de Pascua. Hoy conocemos esa fiesta como Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, nombrada por el Papa San Juan Pablo II en la canonización de Santa Faustina el 30 de abril de 2000.

El Señor expresó su voluntad con respecto a esta fiesta en su primera revelación a santa Faustina. La revelación más completa se puede encontrar en la entrada 699 de su Diario:

"Hija Mía, cuéntale al mundo entero Mi inconcebible misericordia. Deseo que la Fiesta de la Misericordia sea refugio y amparo para todas las almas, y especialmente para los pobres pecadores. Ese día se abren las profundidades mismas de Mi tierna misericordia. Derramo todo un océano de gracias sobre aquellas almas que se acercan a la fuente de Mi misericordia. El alma que se confiese y reciba la Sagrada Comunión obtendrá el completo perdón de los pecados y de las penas. En ese día se abren todas las compuertas divinas por las que fluyen las gracias. Que ningún alma tema acercarse a Mí, aunque sus pecados sean como escarlata. Mi misericordia es tan grande que ninguna mente, sea de hombre o de ángel, podrá sondearla en toda la eternidad. Todo lo que existe proviene de lo más profundo de Mi tiernísima misericordia. Cada alma en su relación Conmigo contemplará Mi amor y Misericordia por toda la eternidad. La Fiesta de la Misericordia surgió desde lo más profundo de Mi ternura. Es Mi deseo que se celebre solemnemente el primer domingo después de Pascua. La humanidad no tendrá paz hasta que recurra a la Fuente de Mi misericordia".

En total, Santa Faustina registró 14 revelaciones de Jesús sobre su deseo para esta fiesta.

Sin embargo, el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia NO es una fiesta basada únicamente en las revelaciones de Santa Faustina. De hecho, no se trata principalmente de Santa Faustina, ni tampoco es una fiesta completamente nueva. El Segundo Domingo de Pascua era ya una solemnidad como Día de la Octava de Pascua. Sin embargo, el título "Domingo de la Divina Misericordia" resalta el significado del día. Litúrgicamente, la Octava Pascual siempre se ha centrado en el tema de la Divina Misericordia y el perdón. El Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, por lo tanto, nos señala el amor misericordioso de Dios que se esconde detrás de todo el Misterio Pascual —todo el misterio de la muerte, sepultura y resurrección de Cristo— hecho presente para nosotros en la Eucaristía. De esta manera resume también toda la Octava Pascual. Como señaló el Papa Juan Pablo II en su discurso Regina Caeli el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia de 1995: "toda la octava de Pascua es como un solo día", y el Domingo de la Octava debe ser el día de "acción de gracias por la bondad de Dios". mostrado al hombre en todo el misterio pascual".

No habrá Adoración (Español) el 25 de Abril.


