Fathers, Husbands, Saints...

Happy Father's Day to all who have fathers or stepfathers, who had fathers, or who are fathers! These holidays of our culture are not exactly high holy days of the Church, but they do give us reason to pause, to pray for, and to reflect on our fathers whom we honor. Five weeks ago, we offered Mass for our moms. This weekend on this Father's Day, we are doing the same – offering our dads, living or dead, on the altar of God during this Holy Mass and invoking our Heavenly Father's blessings on them. Modern America appears to be unique in its honoring of fathers on a special day. Let us celebrate, congratulate, and pray for the men who continue to reflect the Divine qualities of fatherhood as they lovingly establish, nourish, and maintain their families. Fathers are a blessing, and we thank them for blessing us with lives of dedication, endurance and love.

When we look at the lives of canonized fathers, we see that they all display fortitude in principles, fervor in faith, reliance on God's strength, and devotion to their family's spiritual growth. Today, let's focus on three fathers:

Blessed Luigi Beltrame Quattrocchi (born 1880, died 1951): His uncle and aunt brought him up, as they were childless. Luigi's house was always open to beggars and, during the World Wars, to refugees. He and his wife consecrated their family to the Sacred Heart and prayed the Rosary daily with their four children. Additionally, they kept a family Holy Hour on First Fridays, attended retreats, and continually studied their Faith. Inspired by this example, three of Luigi's children entered religious life; the remaining daughter became a consecrated virgin.

Saint Thomas More (born 1478, died 1535): His last words, "I die the king's good servant, and God's first," summarize his whole life. Initially attracted to religious life, Thomas instead married and had four children. He imparted to his children the rich classical education he himself had received and passed on to them his fervent love of God. Before his contrived execution for treason, Thomas ensured—from his prison cell—that all his family could safely escape the country.

Saint Stephen I of Hungary (born 975, died 1038): A child-convert from paganism, he is known as the first king of Hungary. As chief of the Magyars, his objective was to weld the migratory group into a solid nation. He accomplished this through various measures, primarily through his support and promotion of the Catholic Faith. He was crowned king in 1001. He instilled his own deep faith in his son, urging him to remain a devout Catholic king above all else and to protect the growth of the young Church in Hungary. This son is also a saint.

DEL PASTOR

Padres, Esposos, Santos...

¡Feliz Día del Padre a todos los que tienen padres o padrastros, que tuvieron padres o que son padres! Estas fiestas de nuestra cultura no son exactamente días santos de la Iglesia, pero sí nos dan motivos para hacer una pausa, orar y reflexionar sobre nuestros padres a quienes honramos. Hace cinco semanas ofrecimos Misa para nuestras mamás. Este fin de semana, en el Día del Padre, haremos lo mismo: ofrecer a nuestros papás, vivos o muertos, en el altar de Dios durante esta Santa Misa e invocar las bendiciones de nuestro Padre Celestial sobre ellos. La América moderna parece ser única en su homenaje a los padres en un día especial. Celebremos, felicitemos y oremos por los hombres que continúan reflejando las cualidades divinas de la paternidad mientras establecen, alimentan y mantienen con amor a sus familias. Los padres son una bendición y les agradecemos por bendecirnos con vidas de dedicación, resistencia y amor.

Cuando miramos las vidas de los padres canonizados, vemos que todos ellos muestran fortaleza en los principios, fervor en la fe, confianza en la fuerza de Dios y devoción al crecimiento espiritual de su familia. Hoy, centrémonos en tres padres:

Beato Luigi Beltrame Quattrocchi (nacido en 1880, fallecido en 1951): Su tío y su tía lo criaron, ya que no tenían hijos. La casa de Luigi siempre estuvo abierta a los mendigos y, durante las guerras mundiales, a los refugiados. Él y su esposa consagraron a su familia al Sagrado Corazón y rezaron el Rosario diariamente con sus cuatro hijos. Además, mantuvieron una Hora Santa familiar los primeros viernes, asistieron a retiros y estudiaron continuamente su fe. Inspirados por este ejemplo, tres de los hijos de Luigi entraron en la vida religiosa; la hija restante se convirtió en virgen consagrada.

Santo Tomás Moro (nacido en 1478, muerto en 1535): Sus últimas palabras, "Muero como buen siervo del rey y primero de Dios", resumen toda su vida. Inicialmente atraído por la vida religiosa, Thomas se casó y tuvo cuatro hijos. Impartió a sus hijos la rica educación clásica que él mismo había recibido y les transmitió su ferviente amor a Dios. Antes de su ejecución artificial por traición, Thomas se aseguró, desde su celda de la prisión, de que toda su familia pudiera escapar del país con seguridad.

San Esteban I de Hungría (nacido en 975, fallecido en 1038): niño converso del paganismo, es conocido como el primer rey de Hungría. Como jefe de los magiares, su objetivo era unir al grupo migratorio en una nación sólida. Lo logró a través de diversas medidas, principalmente mediante su apoyo y promoción de la fe católica. Fue coronado rey en 1001. Inculcó su profunda fe en su hijo, instándolo a seguir siendo un rey católico devoto por encima de todo y a proteger el crecimiento de la joven Iglesia en Hungría. Este hijo también es un santo.

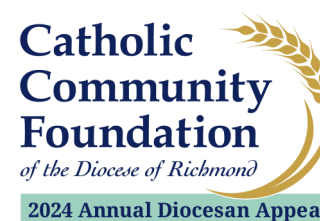

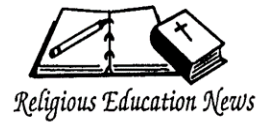

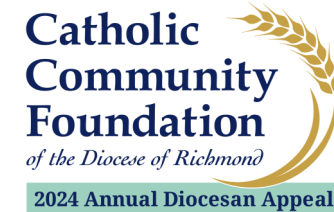
