


# St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter



#### Why Do Catholics Make the Sign of the Cross?

The Sign of the Cross is a prayer in itself, not just an introduction. Most commonly and properly, the words "sign of the cross" are used to describe the large cross traced from forehead to breast and from shoulder to shoulder, such as Catholics are taught to make upon themselves when they begin their prayers, and such also as the priest makes at the foot of the altar when he commences Mass with the words: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Another kind of sign of the cross is that made in the air by bishops, priests, and others in blessing persons or material objects. This cross recurs also many times in the liturgy of the Mass and in nearly all the ritual offices connected with the sacraments and sacramentals. A third variety is represented by the little cross, generally made with the thumb, which the priest or the deacon traces, for example, upon the book of the Gospels and then upon his own forehead, lips, and breast at Mass, as also that made upon the lips in the breviary prayer, or again upon the forehead of the infant in Baptism, and upon the various organs of sense in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, etc. We have positive evidence in the writings of the early Fathers that such a practice was familiar to Christians in the second century. The Church has always attributed effects of grace and power to the use of the holy sign of the cross. Each time that we make the Sign of the Cross and pray the words, we give praise to the Three Persons of the Blessed Trinity.

In the words of this prayer of the Sign of the Cross, we are calling upon the power of the name of God. The words "In the name of" are synonymous with "in the Person of." We are placing ourselves under the power and authority of the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is essential to know that the prayer, the Sign of the Cross, is not complete when leaving out the word Amen. The word Amen at the end of the prayer means, "So be it" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2856). This signifies that we believe the words that we are praying.

The Sign of the Cross expresses two chief mysteries of our Faith: 1) God is a Trinity of Persons – Three Persons, One God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. 2) Jesus died on the Cross for us. So this means that God has loved us so much as to give up His Only Son for our sake to suffer on the Cross, and that we must love Him with our whole hearts.

Therefore, let us strengthen our hope by recalling that all blessings come through the Cross and by fostering a habit of seeking aid through the Cross.


### ¿Por Qué los Católicos Hacen la Señal de la Cruz?

La Señal de la Cruz es una oración en sí misma, no sólo una introducción. Más común y apropiadamente, las palabras "señal de la cruz" se usan para describir la gran cruz trazada desde la frente hasta el pecho y desde el hombro hasta el hombro, como se les enseña a los católicos a hacer sobre sí mismos cuando comienzan sus oraciones, y también como hace el sacerdote al pie del altar cuando comienza la Misa con las palabras: "En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo". Otro tipo de señal de la cruz es la que hacen en el aire obispos, sacerdotes y otras personas para bendecir a personas u objetos materiales. Esta cruz también aparece muchas veces en la liturgia de la Misa y en casi todos los oficios rituales relacionados con los sacramentos y sacramentales. Una tercera variedad está representada por la pequeña cruz, generalmente hecha con el pulgar, que el sacerdote o el diácono traza, por ejemplo, sobre el libro de los Evangelios y luego sobre su propia frente, labios y pecho durante la Misa, como también la que hecho en los labios en la oración del breviario, o nuevamente en la frente del niño en el Bautismo, y en los diversos órganos de los sentidos en el Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos, etc. Tenemos evidencia positiva en los escritos de los primeros Padres. que tal práctica era familiar para los cristianos del siglo II. La Iglesia siempre ha atribuido efectos de gracia y poder al uso de la santa señal de la cruz. Cada vez que hacemos la Señal de la Cruz y rezamos las palabras, alabamos a las Tres Personas de la Santísima Trinidad.

En las palabras de esta oración de la Señal de la Cruz, invocamos el poder del nombre de Dios. Las palabras "En nombre de" son sinónimos de "en la Persona de". Nos estamos colocando bajo el poder y la autoridad del nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Es fundamental saber que la oración, la Señal de la Cruz, no está completa al omitir la palabra Amén. La palabra Amén al final de la oración significa "Que así sea" (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 2856). Esto significa que creemos en las palabras que oramos.

La Señal de la Cruz expresa dos misterios principales de nuestra Fe: 1) Dios es una Trinidad de Personas: Tres Personas, un solo Dios: Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. 2) Jesús murió en la Cruz por nosotros. Entonces esto significa que Dios nos ha amado tanto que entregó a Su Único Hijo por nosotros para sufrir en la Cruz, y que debemos amarlo con todo nuestro corazón.

Por lo tanto, fortalezcamos nuestra esperanza recordando que todas las bendiciones vienen a través de la Cruz y fomentando el hábito de buscar ayuda a través de la Cruz.

### **Healing Body and Soul**

A new chapel recently opened in a hospital in Liubashivka, a rural town in southern Ukraine the first of four such medical chapels co-sponsored by the Knights of Columbus and the International Catholic Migration Commission.

"For the church of Christ, a hospital has always been a place where not only the body but also the soul is helped and treated. For us, as a church, it has always been a priority to be in a hospital, to be near the poor, the hurt, the wounded, the weak and the sick," Bishop Bubniy, the exarch of Odesa and state chaplain for Ukrainian Greek Catholic Knights, said during the ceremony.

Hospital chapels are not as common in southern Ukraine as they are in western areas of the country, and Catholic patients, visitors, and staff are often left without any place to pray, confess, or find comfort. The Odesa Exarchate approached the Knights of Columbus in fall 2023 with Bishop Bubniy's idea, and Knights worked with the ICMC to make it a reality.

ICMC is an international organization established by the Vatican after World War II to support and coordinate Catholic efforts to serve migrants and refugees. The Commission donated funds to renovate the rooms that would be transformed into chapels, while the Knights purchased furnishings and the liturgical items necessary to perform the sacraments.

#### **Tips from the United States Postal Service**

Thefts from mailboxes continue to rise. The United States Postal Service recommends the following tips for sending mail, especially when sending sensitive or valuable items such as checks or items that may contain information such as your social security number or other identifiers. The most secure way to mail sensitive items is to use the local Post Office retail counter. If this isn't feasible, use the wall drop slots inside the Post Office facility. If you must use a blue collection box for your mail, never deposit mail after the last pick-up time, which is indicated on the collection box. Also, avoid leaving mail in the collection boxes on Sundays and federal holidays. Mail left in blue collection boxes overnight is more likely to be stolen.
