


St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

A Modern-Day Eucharistic Miracle in a Time of Turmoil

It happened on a summer night in a tiny town in Bavaria, West Germany, in 1970. Actually, it happened twice. The pastor serving the town of Stich was sick. He couldn't offer Mass for the people, so a visiting Swiss priest assisted him and offered Mass at 8:00PM on Tuesday, June 9, 1970.

But something unusual happened after the Consecration. The priest noticed a red spot on the corporal next to the chalice, a spot that grew to the size of a coin.

At the elevation of the chalice, another spot appeared in the place where the chalice had stood. The priest ensured that the chalice was not leaking, and after Mass, he examined the corporal and the cloths underneath it. No cause could be found for the appearance of the spots. The stained cloths were sent to the Polyclinical Institute of the University of Zurich for analysis. The examiners, who had been told nothing of the origin of the stains, concluded that the stains were caused by human blood, and according to the letter written to the priests informing them of the results: the director of the clinical laboratory said that in his considered judgment the blood was most certainly that of a man in agony.

Five weeks later, at 8 o'clock in the evening on Tuesday, July 14, the Swiss priest was scheduled to celebrate another Mass in Stich. He carefully examined the altar stone, the altar cloths, the corporal, and the chalice prior to Mass and made sure they were completely clean and undamaged. Shortly after the Consecration, the red spots appeared again on the corporal. The priest invited the congregation to inspect the stains after Mass, and they later testified to what they saw. The cloths were again sent for analysis, this time to the District Hospital of Cercee, and again, the scientists concluded that they were caused by human blood.

The '60s and '70s were a time of tremendous upheaval in the world, and in Germany, the Iron Curtain had divided the country in two since the end of World War II. At such times it is easy for us to sideline our faith and allow the events of the world to take priority in our minds. But on two nights, in an insignificant town in a place far from the newspaper headlines, Our Lord sent a miraculous reminder that—no matter how tumultuous the world becomes—He is the center of everything and His Presence is real.

Eucharistic miracles are a powerful way of fortifying our faith and devotion to Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

DEL PASTOR

Un Milagro Eucarístico Moderno en Tiempos de Agitación

Sucedió una noche de verano en un pequeño pueblo de Baviera, Alemania Occidental, en 1970. En realidad, sucedió dos veces. El pastor que servía en el pueblo de Stich estaba enfermo. No podía ofrecer Misa para la gente, por lo que un sacerdote suizo visitante lo ayudó y ofreció Misa a las 8:00 p. m. del martes 9 de Junio de 1970.

Pero algo inusual ocurrió después de la Consagración. El sacerdote notó una mancha roja en el corporal al lado del cáliz, una mancha que creció hasta alcanzar el tamaño de una moneda.

Al elevarse el cáliz, apareció otra mancha en el lugar donde había estado el cáliz. El sacerdote se aseguró de que el cáliz no goteara y, después de la misa, examinó el corporal y los lienzos que se encontraban debajo. No se pudo encontrar ninguna causa para la aparición de las manchas. Los paños manchados fueron enviados al Instituto Policlínico de la Universidad de Zurich para su análisis. Los examinadores, a quienes no se les había dicho nada sobre el origen de las manchas, concluyeron que las manchas eran causadas por sangre humana, y según la carta escrita a los sacerdotes informándoles de los resultados: el director del laboratorio clínico dijo que en su Considerado el juicio, la sangre era con toda seguridad la de un hombre en agonía.

Cinco semanas después, a las 8 de la tarde del martes 14 de Julio, el sacerdote suizo debía celebrar otra misa en Stich. Examinó cuidadosamente la piedra del altar, los manteles, el corporal y el cáliz antes de la Misa y se aseguró de que estuvieran completamente limpios y sin daños. Poco después de la Consagración, las manchas rojas volvieron a aparecer en el corporal. El sacerdote invitó a la congregación a inspeccionar las manchas después de la Misa, y luego testificaron sobre lo que vieron. Las telas fueron enviadas nuevamente para su análisis, esta vez al hospital regional de Cercee, y nuevamente los científicos concluyeron que fueron causadas por sangre humana.

Los años 60 y 70 fueron una época de tremenda agitación en el mundo, y en Alemania, el Telón de Acero había dividido al país en dos desde el final de la Segunda Guerra Mundial. En esos momentos es fácil para nosotros dejar de lado nuestra fe y permitir que los acontecimientos del mundo tengan prioridad en nuestras mentes. Pero durante dos noches, en un pueblo insignificante en un lugar alejado de los titulares de los periódicos, Nuestro Señor envió un recordatorio milagroso de que, por muy tumultuoso que se vuelva el mundo, Él es el centro de todo y Su Presencia es real.

Los milagros eucarísticos son una manera poderosa de fortalecer nuestra fe y devoción a Nuestro Señor Sacramentado.
