


St. Timothy Lumen Christi Society Chapter

Dear Parishioners,

Please join us the weekend of August 10, 2024, to hear Reverend Robert C. Sieg speak at all the services about a ministry providing direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean.

Father Sieg will share personal witness about Food for the Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another.

Rev. Robert C. Sieg, OFM is a Franciscan living in Saint Louis, Missouri and is currently in fulltime ministry as a director of the Franciscan Connection. Fr. Bob was born in Cleveland, Ohio. While attending a Franciscan high school in the Cleveland area, he went on a trip to visit the Franciscan College Seminary in Illinois so he could miss two days of school. Fifty-seven plus years later Fr. Bob is still a Franciscan priest. Other than serving as pastor of many parishes, Fr. Bob has served in other capacities, a couple being: Chaplain at a jail; Vocation Minister, helping young people to discern God's Calling; Campus Minister at his high school. As a Franciscan, Fr. Bob was always serving the poor wherever he was in many ways. He came to Food for the Poor through a couple of other Franciscan priests who were working for this ministry. Fr. Bob served in this way for about three years but then had to take time away to attend to fulltime needs of his Order. Fr. Bob is once again able to share his love for the poor by preaching on weekends on their behalf.

Please join me in welcoming Father Sieg.

El Padre Sieg compartirá su testimonio personal sobre la misión de Food for the Poor de cuidar a los indigentes como un medio para vivir el mandato del Evangelio de amarnos unos a otros.

El Reverendo Robert C. Sieg, OFM, es un Franciscano que vive en Saint Louis, Missouri y actualmente se encuentra en el ministerio de tiempo completo como director de Franciscan Connection. El Padre Bob nació en Cleveland, Ohio. Mientras asistía a una escuela secundaria franciscana en el área de Cleveland, realizó un viaje para visitar el Seminario Universitario Franciscano en Illinois para poder faltar dos días a la escuela. Cincuenta y siete años después, el Padre Bob sigue siendo sacerdote Franciscano. Además de servir como pastor de muchas parroquias, el Padre Bob ha servido en otras funciones, algunas de ellas: Capellán en una cárcel; Ministro de Vocaciones, ayudando a los jóvenes a discernir el llamado de Dios; Ministro del Campus en su escuela secundaria. Como Franciscano, el Padre Bob siempre estuvo al servicio de los pobres dondequiera que estuviera de muchas maneras. Llegó a Food for the Poor a través de un par de sacerdotes Franciscanos que trabajaban para este ministerio. El Padre Bob sirvió de esta manera durante unos tres años, pero luego tuvo que tomarse un tiempo para atender las necesidades de su Orden a tiempo completo. El Padre Bob puede compartir una vez más su amor por los pobres predicando los fines de semana en su nombre


