#### One Wild and Precious Life By Sister Marcia Sichol, SHCJ

These words from Mary Oliver's poem, "The Summer Day," captures the meaning of "vocation," a vocation to any way of life. A vocation to any profession or way of life doesn't happen in just one moment. We have only one "wild and precious life," and so we must not squander it. We must listen carefully to all God's messages, or "nudges," to us along our life journey.

My own vocation story is perhaps not so different from others you may hear or read about. It took several years for my own vocation to crystalize. It took years of listening, all the way from the State of Maine, where I was born, to the banks of the Rappahannock River in Tappahannock, Virginia. This journey changed me by moving me to a new geography, a new accent, a new history, and a new culture. My life had taken several significant changes over my first 17 years: my father died at an early age, and we moved from Maine, where I was born, to Massachusetts. I had always gone to public schools, but after that move, it seemed the schools near my new home were not too good. My family arranged that I would go to the Catholic school that my cousin attended in New York. I lived with my uncle's family and went to school there for that year. At the end of the year, another move brought me to Richmond, Virginia. My mother had married my father's cousin, who actually had the same name—first, middle and last! He had lost his wife and had two young boys and a daughter already married and living in another state. While my new "hybrid" family suited me well, I just didn't seem to "fit" in that very Southern culture and I asked to return to my school in New York for my last two years.

While I was away in school, my family moved to a house right on the Rappahannock River in Tappahannock, Virginia. This was a happy place, too, and when I came home for the two summers I was to have there, I learned to water ski. We spent hours on the water, where my father pulled me on skis, and I pulled him. We both managed to "ditch" each other a few times! Our neighbors, the Carrerases, and our family spent as much time skiing as we could manage during those summers. I learned later that as the younger children grew up, the town of Tappahannock enjoyed watching them ski up and down the river in the late afternoons. Even my mom learned to ski!

One night after supper during that second summer, I went to the riverbank, just to sit and enjoy the view of the sun setting and all the colors playing on the water. It seems it was just a random thought that suddenly came to me: "But is this happiness all there is? Is there something more?"

## **DEL PASTOR**

#### Una Vida Salvaje y Preciosa Por la Hermana Marcia Sichol, SHCJ

Estas palabras del poema de Mary Oliver, "El Día de Verano", captan el significado de la "vocación", una vocación a cualquier forma de vida. Una vocación a cualquier profesión o forma de vida no sucede en un solo momento. Tenemos solo una "vida salvaje y preciosa", y por eso no debemos desperdiciarla. Debemos escuchar atentamente todos los mensajes, "empujoncitos", que Dios nos da a lo largo de nuestro viaje por la vida.

La historia de mi propia vocación tal vez no sea tan diferente de otras sobre las que puede escuchar o leer. Mi propia vocación tardó varios años en cristalizarse. Fueron necesarios años de escucha, desde el estado de Maine, donde nací, hasta las orillas del río Rappahannock en Tappahannock, Virginia. Este viaje me cambió al trasladarme a una nueva geografía, un nuevo acento, una nueva historia y una nueva cultura. Mi vida había sufrido varios cambios importantes durante mis primeros 17 años: mi padre murió a una edad temprana y nos mudamos de Maine, donde nací, a Massachusetts. Siempre había ido a escuelas públicas, pero después de esa mudanza, parecía que las escuelas cerca de mi nuevo hogar no eran demasiado buenas. Mi familia arregló que yo fuera a la escuela católica a la que asistía mi primo en Nueva York. Viví con la familia de mi tío y fui a la escuela allí durante ese año. Al final del año, otra mudanza me llevó a Richmond, Virginia. Mi madre se había casado con el primo de mi padre, que en realidad tenía el mismo nombre, ¡primero, segundo y apellido! Había perdido a su esposa y tenía dos niños pequeños y una hija ya casada y viviendo en otro estado. Si bien mi nueva familia "híbrida" me venía bien, simplemente no parecía "encajar" en esa cultura tan sureña y pedí regresar a mi escuela en Nueva York para mis últimos dos años.

Mientras estaba fuera estudiando, mi familia se mudó a una casa justo en el río Rappahannock en Tappahannock, Virginia. Este también era un lugar feliz, y cuando volví a casa para los dos veranos que iba a pasar allí, aprendí a esquiar en el agua. Pasábamos horas en el agua, donde mi padre me llevaba con los esquís y yo lo llevaba a él. ¡Ambos logramos "deshacernos" el uno del otro unas cuantas veces! Nuestros vecinos, los Carreras, y nuestra familia pasamos tanto tiempo esquiando como pudimos durante esos veranos. Más tarde me enteré de que, cuando los niños más pequeños crecieron, la ciudad de Tappahannock disfrutaba viéndolos esquiar río arriba y río abajo por las tardes. ¡Incluso mi madre aprendió a esquiar!

Una noche después de cenar durante ese segundo verano, fui a la orilla del río, solo para sentarme y disfrutar de la vista de la puesta de sol y todos los colores jugando en el agua. Parece que fue solo un pensamiento aleatorio que me vino de repente: "Pero ¿es esta felicidad todo lo que hay? ¿Hay algo más?"


