Is Converting to Catholicism Necessary to Save a Relationship?

Conclusion of Article by Joe Heschmeyer in the Catholic Daily Answers

You might object here: "I'm not saying not to follow Jesus—I'm just saying not to become Catholic!" But the whole point is that for the person for whom Jesus has revealed the truth of the Catholic Church, remaining Protestant (or Orthodox, etc.) is to cease to follow him. It does no good to say we're going to follow Jesus on our terms, just as it would have done Jesus' original listeners no good to say they were going to follow the God of Abraham on their own terms. If Jesus shows you the way in which he wants you to follow him, that's not the time to do your own thing or stay in your comfort zone. That's the time to pick up your cross and follow him, even if he's leading you somewhere weird and uncomfortable (like the Catholic Church).

Fortunately, though, Jesus doesn't just tell us about the high cost of discipleship. He also promises us that these earthly costs of converting will be worth it. He tells the rich young man, "Go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me" (Matthew 19:21). Perhaps piqued by this mention of heavenly treasure, St. Peter then asks, "Lord, we have left everything and followed you. What then shall we have?" (Matthew 19:27). Jesus responds by promising that "everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for my name's sake, will receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life" (Matthew 19:29).

In other words, discipleship isn't just about sacrifice, but about investing, laying up for ourselves "treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal" (Matthew 6:20). Converting to Catholicism can be scary, and it can be costly. But take courage: whatever it costs you will be well worth it, both in this life and in the life to come.

¿Es Necesario Convertirse al Catolicismo para Salvar una Relación?

Podrías objetar aquí: "No estoy diciendo que no sigas a Jesús, ¡solo estoy diciendo que no te vuelvas Católico!". Pero el punto es que para la persona a quien Jesús le ha revelado la verdad de la Iglesia Católica, seguir siendo Protestante (u Ortodoxo, etc.) es dejar de seguirlo. No sirve de nada decir que vamos a seguir a Jesús en nuestros términos, así como no les habría servido de nada a los oyentes originales de Jesús decir que iban a seguir al Dios de Abraham en sus propios términos. Si Jesús te muestra el camino en el que quiere que lo sigas, ese no es el momento de hacer lo que quieras o quedarte en tu zona de confort. Ese es el momento de tomar tu cruz y seguirlo, incluso si te está llevando a un lugar extraño e incómodo (como la Iglesia Católica).

Afortunadamente, Jesús no solo nos habla del alto costo del discipulado. También nos promete que estos costos terrenales de la conversión valdrán la pena. Le dice al joven rico: "Ve, vende lo que tienes y dalo a los pobres, y tendrás un tesoro en el cielo; luego, ven y sígueme" (Mateo 19:21). Tal vez picado por esta mención del tesoro celestial, San Pedro pregunta: "Señor, nosotros lo hemos dejado todo y te hemos seguido. ¿Qué tendremos, pues?" (Mateo 19:27). Jesús responde prometiendo que "todo el que haya dejado casas, hermanos, hermanas, padre, madre, hijos o tierras por mi nombre, recibirá cien veces más y heredará la vida eterna" (Mateo 19:29).

En otras palabras, el discipulado no se trata solo de sacrificio, sino de invertir, de acumular para nosotros mismos "tesoros en el cielo, donde ni la polilla ni el óxido corrompen, y donde los ladrones no minan ni hurtan" (Mateo 6:20). Convertirse al catolicismo puede ser aterrador y costoso, pero tenga valor: cualquier costo que tenga valdrá la pena, tanto en esta vida como en la venidera.
