

### La Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo

Esta Solemnidad, comúnmente conocida como la Fiesta de Cristo Rey, es una fiesta litúrgica celebrada por la Iglesia Católica Romana, así como por muchas otras denominaciones cristianas. Instituida por el Papa Pío XI en 1925, la Fiesta ocurre el último domingo del año litúrgico, justo antes de que comience el Adviento. Sirve como un poderoso recordatorio de la autoridad omnipresente de Cristo, nuestro Rey, y nuestro llamado final a servirle. Cuando el Papa Pío XI instituyó la Fiesta de Cristo Rey, el mundo estaba en un estado tumultuoso. El malestar político y social estaba extendido, y había una creciente preocupación por el secularismo y la marginación de la religión. El Papa quería combatir estos problemas sociales enfatizando la autoridad soberana de Cristo. Lo describió en su encíclica Quas Primas. Dijo: "Cristo es Rey en todos los sentidos. Él es el Rey de toda la creación porque "todas las cosas fueron creadas por medio de él y para él" (Colosenses 1:16). También es el Rey de nuestras almas, guiándonos hacia la vida eterna.

La Escritura subraya el reinado de Jesús en muchas áreas. Un ejemplo destacado viene del Evangelio de Juan, donde Jesús le dice a Pilato: "Mi reino no es de este mundo" (Juan 18:36). Su respuesta resalta que su autoridad no es política sino espiritual y eterna

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica afirma el reinado de Cristo en varias secciones. Dice: "A Jesucristo, el Santo Padre le confía y le ofrece las llaves de este Reino" (CIC 2816). Además, declara que Cristo es "Señor del cosmos y de la historia" (CIC 450). El Catecismo también explica que "el reino de Cristo aún no ha llegado a su plenitud 'hasta que haya puesto a todos sus enemigos bajo sus pies" (CIC 671), lo que significa que la extensión plena de su realeza se hará evidente al final de los tiempos.

Esta solemnidad es un llamado a reconocer y aceptar la autoridad soberana de Jesús en nuestras vidas, no solo como una figura histórica o un maestro ético, sino como el Rey viviente y eterno. A medida que nos acercamos al final del año litúrgico, la Fiesta sirve como culminación y preparación. Es la culminación de nuestro viaje anual a través de los misterios de la fe, y nos prepara para el Adviento, donde anticipamos la segunda venida de Cristo en gloria.

Por lo tanto, entreguémonos completamente a Jesucristo, quien es "el camino, la verdad y la vida" (Jn 14:6), y el Rey eterno del Universo.

Este jueves es un día de acción de gracias nacional. Que recuerden las bendiciones y la protección que Dios nos ha dado, nuestro gobierno democrático y la prosperidad que disfrutamos, nuestra libertad de expresión y religión y, por último, la generosidad y la buena voluntad de nuestro pueblo.

### The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

This Solemnity, commonly referred to as the Feast of Christ the King, is a liturgical feast celebrated by the Roman Catholic Church, as well as many other Christian denominations. Instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, the Feast occurs on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, right before Advent starts. It serves as a powerful reminder of the all-encompassing authority of Christ, our King, and our ultimate call to serve Him. When Pope Pius XI instituted the Feast of Christ the King, the world was in a tumultuous state. Political and social unrest was rife, and there was a growing concern about secularism and the marginalization of religion. The Pope wanted to combat these societal issues by emphasizing the sovereign authority of Christ. He outlined this in his encyclical Quas Primas. He said, "Christ is King in every sense. He is King of all creation because 'all things were created through him, and for him" (Colossians 1:16). He is also the King of our souls, guiding us towards eternal life.

Scripture is underlined with the Kingship of Jesus in many areas. One prominent example comes from the Gospel of John, where Jesus says to Pilate, "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36). His answer highlights that His authority is not political but spiritual and eternal.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church affirms the kingship of Christ in several sections. It states, "To Jesus Christ, the Holy Father entrusts and offers the keys of this Kingdom" (CCC 2816). It further declares that Christ is "Lord of the cosmos and of history" (CCC 450). The Catechism also explains that "Christ's reign is yet to be fully accomplished 'until he puts all his enemies under his feet" (CCC 671), meaning that the full extent of His kingship will be apparent at the end of time.

This solemnity is a call to recognize and accept the sovereign authority of Jesus in our lives, not just as a historical figure or ethical teacher, but as the living, eternal King. As we move towards the end of the liturgical year, the Feast serves as both a culmination and a preparation. It is the culmination of our annual journey through the mysteries of the faith, and it prepares us for Advent, where we anticipate Christ's second coming in glory.

So, let us surrender ourselves fully to Jesus Christ, who is "the way and the truth and the life" (John 14:6), and the eternal King of the Universe.
