

## The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has stated that the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – transferred this year to Monday, December 9th – will be celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation. Previously, when the date was transferred, the obligation was abrogated. That is no longer true. Earlier this year, Bishop Thomas J. Paprocki, Chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance, wrote to the Holy See seeking clarification about the obligation to attend Mass when a Holy Day of Obligation in Advent, Lent, or Easter falls on Sunday and the Solemnity is transferred to Monday. In a memo to the U.S. bishops dated Thursday, October 10, Bishop Paprocki communicated the Dicastery for Legislative Text's response: "the feast must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred." In light of this new directive, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, December 9, 2024, is to be observed as a Holy Day of Obligation."

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception honors the Blessed Mother's purity, pointing to the fact that she was conceived without original sin. It was defined in 1854 by Pope Pius IX as a dogma of faith through Ineffabilis Deus. "From the first moment of her conception, Mary was preserved immune from original sin by the singular grace of God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, savior of human race" (CCC #491). This means that original sanctity, innocence, and justice were conferred upon her, and that she was exempted from all the evil effects of original sin, excluding sorrow, pain, disease, and death which are temporal penalties given to Adam.

The U.S. bishops unanimously named Mary, under her title of the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of the Nation in 1846, during the Sixth Provincial Council of Baltimore.

Therefore, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 9, 2024) is not only a Holy Day of Obligation, but also our feast as a Nation. Mass on Monday, December 9th will be at noon.

## **DEL PASTOR**

## La Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción

La Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB) ha declarado que la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción, trasladada este año al Lunes 9 de Diciembre, se celebrará como un día de precepto. Anteriormente, cuando se trasladaba la fecha, se abrogaba la obligación. Esto ya no es así. A principios de este año, el obispo Thomas J. Paprocki, presidente del Comité de Asuntos Canónicos y Gobierno de la Iglesia de la USCCB, escribió a la Santa Sede pidiendo una aclaración sobre la obligación de asistir a Misa cuando un día de precepto de Adviento, Cuaresma o Pascua cae en domingo y la solemnidad se traslada al Lunes. En un memorando a los obispos estadounidenses fechado el Jueves 10 de Octubre, el obispo Paprocki comunicó la respuesta del Dicasterio para el Texto Legislativo: "la fiesta debe observarse como un día de precepto en el día al que se traslada". A la luz de esta nueva directiva, la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción, el Lunes 9 de Diciembre de 2024, se observará como un Día Santo de Precepto".

La Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción honra la pureza de la Santísima Madre, señalando el hecho de que fue concebida sin pecado original. Fue definida en 1854 por el Papa Pío IX como un dogma de fe a través de Ineffabilis Deus. "Desde el primer momento de su concepción, María fue preservada inmune del pecado original por la gracia singular de Dios y en virtud de los méritos de Jesucristo, salvador del género humano" (CIC # 491). Esto significa que se le confirió la santidad, la inocencia, y la justicia originales, y que fue eximida de todos los efectos malignos del pecado original, excluyendo la tristeza, el dolor, la enfermedad y la muerte, que son penas temporales dadas a Adán.

Los obispos de Estados Unidos nombraron por unanimidad a María, bajo su advocación de la Inmaculada Concepción, patrona de la nación en 1846, durante el Sexto Concilio Provincial de Baltimore.

Por lo tanto, la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción (9 de Diciembre de 2024) no es solo un Día Santo de Obligación, sino también nuestra fiesta como Nación. La Misa del Lunes 9 de Diciembre será al mediodía.


