

St. Timothy Church Renovation Project

I am excited to announce an upcoming church painting and re-carpeting project here at St. Timothy, commencing next week. It may not be the best time of the year to do this, but it is the best option we have. This initiative is part of our commitment to improving the Church building, which started with re-roofing the Church building (completed last year), and continues with painting the inside of the Church, Commons, bathrooms, sacristy, and the two side mechanical and audio rooms. After painting the inside of the Church, the contractor, Ainsworth Decorating, LLC, is going to replace the carpet in the Church nave.

The project commences on Monday, March 10, 2025, and is anticipated to be completed in 4 weeks, provided no issues arise. During this period, you may notice some changes, including:

All weekday and weekend Liturgies will be celebrated in St. Jude Hall.

The Church building will be out of bounds, but we can still use the parking lot.

Religious Education classes will not be affected.

Proyecto de Renovación de la Iglesia de St. Timoteo

Me complace anunciar un próximo proyecto de pintura y alfombrado de la iglesia aquí en St. Timothy, que comenzará la próxima semana. Puede que no sea el mejor momento del año para hacerlo, pero es la mejor opción que tenemos. Esta iniciativa es parte de nuestro compromiso de mejorar el edificio de la Iglesia, que comenzó con la renovación del techo del edificio de la Iglesia (finalizado el año pasado) y continúa con la pintura del interior de la Iglesia, los Comunes, los baños, la sacristía y las dos salas de máquinas y audio laterales. Después de pintar el interior de la Iglesia, el contratista, Ainsworth Decorating, LLC, reemplazará la alfombra en la nave de la Iglesia.

El proyecto comienza el lunes 10 de Marzo de 2025 y se prevé que se complete en 4 semanas, siempre que no surjan problemas. Durante este período, es posible que notes algunos cambios, entre ellos:

Gifts of Stock: Avoid Capital Gains Tax!

If you own appreciated stock, you may wish to consider giving the stock to the parish rather than cash. You are able to deduct the full value, avoid the capital gain tax and make a substantial gift to the parish. A good steward uses his or her assets in a way that does the most good.

Giving appreciated stock you have held for more than a year is better than giving cash. If you donate stock that has increased in value since you bought it more than a year ago – and if you itemize deductions — you can take a charitable deduction for the stock's fair market value on the day you give it away. To donate a gift of stock, please contact the parish office.



Saint of the Week - Saint John of God



Saint John of God lived from 1498 to 1550. He was a Portuguese soldier who fell away from the Church during his military service. At 40, he decided to devote his life to God's service and went to Africa hoping to free Christian captives. He eventually left Africa for Spain, where he was moved by a sermon of Saint John of Avila and repented for his past life by publicly beating himself and begging for mercy. His actions caused him to be committed to a mental hospital, where St. John of Avila visited him, advising him to

be more actively involved in tending the needs of others. St. John of God, after leaving the hospital, established a house where he tended to the needs of the sick poor, often begging to support the home. However, as people became aware of his work, they were inspired by his devotion, and began to support him with money and goods. Among St. John's supporters were the archbishop and marquis of Tarifa. Underlying St. John's outward acts of concern and love for Christ's sick poor was a deep interior prayer life reflected in his spirit of humility. These qualities attracted followers who formed the Brothers Hospitallers twenty years after St. John's death. This is now an international religious order. St. John is the patron saint of booksellers, firefighters (after saving patients from a hospital fire, depicted here), heart patients, hospitals, nurses, printers, and the sick, and his memorial is celebrated on March 8, which is the anniversary of both his birth and his death.
