



Bishop Barry C. Knestout and the Catholic Diocese of Richmond Mourn the Passing of Pope Francis April 21, 2025



In Memoriam Pope Francis December 17, 1936 - April 21, 2025 Bishop Barry C. Knestout has issued the following statement regarding the passing of Pope Francis:

"Along with the faithful of the Catholic Diocese of Richmond, I mourn the passing of Pope Francis with great sadness and offer prayers to Our Lord for the happy repose of his soul.

As I reflect on his pontificate, I marvel at the way each Holy Father makes a unique imprint on the papacy and the Catholic Church. Pope Francis' charisms were his simple, conversational style, and his charitable efforts in reaching out to those on the peripheries – the poor, vulnerable, and alienated. His emphasis on synodality has taught us that by listening attentively to one another, we can love as Christ in a fractured and polarized world.

I was blessed to meet Pope Francis three times – most recently in Rome last October during a pilgrimage made by the parishioners of the Basilica of St. Andrew, Roanoke. During each of our encounters, the pope greeted me

with a gentle, friendly smile, and just a few words in English: "Pray for me!"

I assured him then of our prayers. We continue to pray now for this devoted shepherd of the Church. We commend his soul to the care of Christ, the Good Shepherd. Guided by Pope Francis' pastoral example, may the Church continually make progress in charity, imitating more perfectly Christ's merciful love in all we think, say, and do."

El Obispo Barry C. Knestout ha emitido la siguiente declaración sobre el fallecimiento del Papa Francisco:

"Junto con los fieles de la Diócesis Católica de Richmond, lamento con profunda tristeza el fallecimiento del Papa Francisco y ofrezco oraciones a Nuestro Señor por el feliz descanso de su alma.

Al reflexionar sobre su pontificado, me maravillo ante la forma en que cada Santo Padre deja una huella única en el papado y en la Iglesia Católica. Los carismas del Papa Francisco fueron su estilo sencillo y conversacional, y sus esfuerzos caritativos por acercarse a los marginados: los pobres, los vulnerables y los marginados. Su énfasis en la sinodalidad nos ha enseñado que, al escucharnos atentamente unos a otros, podemos amar como Cristo en un mundo fracturado y polarizado.

Tuve la bendición de conocer al Papa Francisco en tres ocasiones; la más reciente en Roma el pasado octubre, durante una peregrinación de los feligreses de la Basílica de San Andrés, Roanoke. En cada uno de nuestros encuentros, el Papa me saludó con una sonrisa amable y amable, y solo unas palabras en inglés: "¡Reza por mí!".

Saint of the Week - Saint Catherine of Siena



Born on the Feast of the Annunciation, March 25, 1347, Caterina di Giacomo di Benincasa was the twenty-fourth of twentyfive children. Saint Catherine is known as the Doctor of Unity for bringing about the union of the Papacy and returning it to Rome after nearly a century in France. She dictated, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, four treatises called "The Dialogues." She also wrote nearly four hundred letters and a series of prayers. St. Catherine of Siena was canonized by Pope Pius II in

1461, and named Patron Saint of Italy on May 5, 1940 by Pope Pius XII. She was given the title of Doctor of the Church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI. She is the Patron Saint of Siena, the Patron Saint of Italy, and the Patron Saint of Europe, as proclaimed by St. John Paul II in October 1999. Today, the body of St. Catherine is in a tomb in the Basilica di Santa Maria sopra Minerva in Rome, and her head is enshrined, incorrupt, in San Domenico Church in Siena, Italy.

St. Catherine is honored by the Catholic Church on April 29. She is also the patroness of nurses, people ridiculed for their piety, and against fires, illnesses, and miscarriages.
