Why Do Catholics Baptize Infants?

As with the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the meaning and understanding of Baptism is intimately rooted in the Jewish tradition. Ancient Jews did not choose their faith; it was something into which they were born. A Jew became a Jew simply by being born into a Jewish family. In this way, Jewish parents not only gave their children the gift of life, but also the gift of faith.

Even as early as the Fourth century, the Church understood infant Baptism in reference to Judaism. Saint Augustine, in refuting the Donatist heresy, wrote, "We can form a true conjecture of the value of the sacrament of Baptism in the case of infants, from the parallel of circumcision" (Against the Donatists, Book IV, Chapter 24-32). Circumcision marked a Jewish child's entrance into the community of faith. It was not something he chose, but rather, something that was chosen for him. Just as his parents chose to bring him into the world and chose to feed him healthy food, they also chose to offer him the most important thing in life—faith. Faith is a gift freely given; it is not something we can demand or steal. Infant Baptism helps us remember that faith is a free gift. Just as parents are co-givers with God in bringing forth the gift of life, they are also co-givers of the gift of faith. Children are physical, tangible expressions of the love that a husband and wife have for one another. Ideally, a husband and wife love one another so much that their love cannot be contained within themselves, but it overflows into the lives of their children. Faith works the same way.

When parents bring their children to church to be baptized, we are recognizing that their faith in Jesus Christ is so abundant that it cannot be contained among them, but it overflows into the lives of their children. Through Baptism, like in Jewish circumcision, children become members of the faith community. Having been given the gift of faith through baptism, it is the responsibility of the community to help the newly baptized to unwrap that gift. Regardless of one's age when receiving Baptism, each person must come to that point in life when he or she accepts the gift of faith they have been given and chooses to live it. The hope that is inherent in infant Baptism is that the gift of faith that has been freely given and that has been nurtured for many years will eventually be so strongly rooted in a Christian's heart that he or she would never want to live without it.

This weekend, let's welcome Josephina M. Volo, who is going to be baptized at Sunday morning mass.

¿Por qué los Católicos Bautizan a los Bebés?

Al igual que con el sacramento de la Eucaristía, el significado y la comprensión del bautismo están profundamente arraigados en la tradición judía. Los antiguos judíos no elegían su fe; era algo en lo que nacían. Un judío se convertía en judío simplemente por nacer en una familia judía. De esta manera, los padres judíos no solo daban a sus hijos el don de la vida, sino también el don de la fe.

Ya en el siglo IV, la Iglesia entendía el bautismo infantil en referencia al judaísmo. San Agustín, al refutar la herejía donatista, escribió: «Podemos formular una conjetura correcta sobre el valor del sacramento del bautismo en el caso de los bebés, a partir del paralelo de la circuncisión» (Contra los donatistas, Libro IV, Capítulos 24-32). La circuncisión marcaba la entrada de un niño judío a la comunidad de fe. No era algo que él elegía, sino algo que le fue elegido. Así como sus padres decidieron traerlo al mundo y alimentarlo con alimentos saludables, también decidieron ofrecerle lo más importante de la vida: la fe. La fe es un don gratuito; no es algo que podamos exigir ni robar. El bautismo infantil nos ayuda a recordar que la fe es un don gratuito. Así como los padres son codonadores con Dios al dar a luz el don de la vida, también son codonadores del don de la fe. Los hijos son expresiones físicas y tangibles del amor que se tienen el esposo y la esposa. Idealmente, un esposo y una esposa se aman tanto que su amor no puede contenerse en sí mismos, sino que se desborda en la vida de sus hijos. La fe funciona de la misma manera.

Cuando los padres traen a sus hijos a la iglesia para ser bautizados, reconocemos que su fe en Jesucristo es tan abundante que no puede contenerse en ellos, sino que se desborda en la vida de sus hijos. A través del bautismo, como en la circuncisión judía, los niños se convierten en miembros de la comunidad de fe. Habiendo recibido el don de la fe a través del Bautismo, es responsabilidad de la comunidad ayudar a los recién bautizados a abrir ese regalo. Independientemente de la edad que tengan al recibir el Bautismo, cada persona debe llegar a ese punto en la vida en que acepta el don de la fe que se le ha dado y decide vivirlo. La esperanza inherente al Bautismo de niños es que el don de la fe, otorgado libremente y cultivado durante muchos años, se arraigue tan profundamente en el corazón del cristiano que nunca querrá vivir sin él.

Este fin de semana, demos la bienvenida a Josephine M. Volo, quien será bautizada en la misa dominical.

Saint of the Week - Saint Philip Neri



Born in Florence on July 21, 1515, Saint Philip Neri was founder of the Congregation of the Oratory, a community of Catholic priests and lay brothers. He was sent to live with a wealthy family member in San Germano to assist in the family business. St. Philip credited his mystical encounter with the Lord for his Christian conversion. He soon lost interest in material things and the family business, feeling a calling to serve Christ and His Church.

In 1548, with the help of his confessor, Father Persiano Rossa, St. Philip Neri founded a confraternity for poor laymen to meet for spiritual exercises and service of the poor, the Confraternity

of the Most Holy Trinity. Fr. Rossa convinced St. Philip that his work would be more effective if he were a priest. Ordained to the diaconate and then into the priesthood on May 23, 1551, St. Philip Neri served as confessor to the growing number of pilgrims and other priests called on to assist him. St. Philip and the priests became known as the "Oratorians," because they would ring a bell to call the faithful in their "oratory." St. Philip's rule for the Congregation of the Oratory was simple share a common table and perform spiritual exercises. St. Philip didn't want his followers to bind themselves to the life with a vow and he did not want them to denounce their property. St. Philip's organization was officially recognized by Pope Gregory XIII in 1575.

St. Philip Neri was beatified by Pope Paul V on May 11, 1615, and canonized by Pope Gregory XV on March 12, 1622. He is the Patron Saint of Rome, the U.S. Special Forces, humor, and joy; and the Church honors him on May 26.
