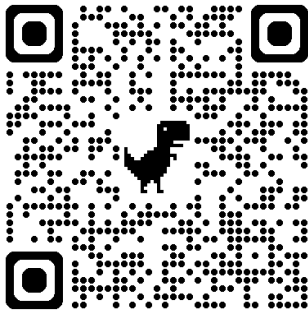

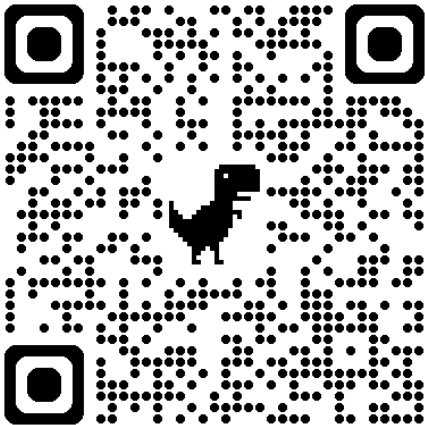

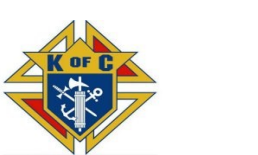

The Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree, also known as the Patriotic Degree, is the highest and most prestigious degree within the Knights of Columbus organization. It emphasizes patriotism and active Catholic citizenship, with members dedicated to serving their Church, country, and the Order.

Here's a more detailed look at the key aspects of the Fourth Degree:

Patriotism and Citizenship: The core purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster patriotism and encourage active Catholic citizenship.

Distinct Uniform: Fourth Degree members are known for their distinctive uniform, which includes a navy blue blazer, gray trousers, and a black beret.

Color Corps: Assemblies organize Color Corps, which participate in parades, public events, and ceremonies, often providing honor guards and escorts.

"Sir Knight" Title: Fourth Degree members are addressed as "Sir Knight."

To join, a Knight must be a Third Degree member in good standing, over 18 years old, a citizen of their country of residence, and a practicing Catholic in union with the Holy See.

There is no waiting period to join after becoming a Third Degree member.

In essence, the Fourth Degree provides a way for Knights to further express their patriotism and commitment to their faith and country.

Saint of the Week - Saint Mary Magdalene



Mentioned fourteen times in the gospels, Saint Mary Magdalene was a devoted follower of Jesus, who accompanied him through pivotal moments of his ministry – on his last trip to Jerusalem, at the cross, and discovering his resurrection at the tomb. Mary Magdalene is especially significant as the first witness to see Jesus following the resurrection. In a time when women were regarded as second-class citizens, God gave Mary – a woman – a highly significant honor by appearing to her first and charging her to spread the news of his resurrection. At first, the disciples did not want to believe her when she told them.

Mary Magdalene’s story is one of redemption. When Jesus met her, she was possessed by seven demons – a number, which by some accounts, is thought to signify the completeness of the extent to which they had overtaken her mind. At that point in time, Mary was likely deranged, subject to fits of outburst, and exhibiting an untidy, disheveled appearance. However, though her mind was altered, this did not affect her moral condition. Her behavior may have been extremely abnormal, but it was not extremely immoral. Jesus cast out these demons from Mary, restoring her sanity and redeeming her mental state. Following his restoration of her mind, Mary began to accompany Jesus and his followers. St. Mary Magdalene’s redemption and subsequent life of devotion to Christ serve as a powerful example of Christ’s love and power.

St. Mary Magdalene is the patron saint of contemplative life, converts, glove makers, hairstylists, penitent sinners, people ridiculed for their piety, perfumeries and perfumers, pharmacists, and women. She is also known as the “Apostle to the Apostles.” The Church honors her on July 22.
